#### HUMAN GROWTH, DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION POLICY

Any parent or legal guardian of a Waterbury Public School student may exempt his/her child from any or all lessons dealing with Human Growth, Development and Family Life portions of the Health and Wellness Education Curriculum. This may be done by **written notification** to the Principal of the building that the child attends. Copies of the curriculum are available at the school for parent review. If you would like to read the curriculum, please call the school and make an appointment to come in and review the material.

## NOTE FROM THE ATTENDANCE COUNSELOR

- Parents, please call to reschedule attendance meetings if you are unable to attend. Failure to attend meetings can lead to further referrals to outside resources such as Court and DCF.
- Remember, children are only allowed to have a total of 20 absences for the school year. While this number includes both excused and unexcused absences, it is still important to provide notes, especially in the event that an appeal is needed to pass to the next grade.
- School begins at 9:35am when there is a 90 minute delay.

## NURSE'S NOTES

Yea Spring! If you have received a vision referral from the nurse's office, please communicate any information concerning glasses to the nurse's office. Reports are sent to the Waterbury Health Department for follow thru. Please remember if you are planning to bring in cupcakes/treats for your child, all food items must be cleared with the nurse's office first, and the teacher notified. There are many students with food allergies in Duggan School. There are still a number of 6<sup>th</sup> grade students who have not had a mandatory physical exam. Please note: any student who does not complete the mandatory physical exam assessment by the 1<sup>st</sup> day of classes in August 2014 will be <u>excluded</u> from 7<sup>th</sup> grade.
