#### **CAPT Testing For 10<sup>th</sup> Graders**



This March, students in grade 10 statewide will participate in the Connecticut Academic Performance Test (CAPT) in science. This test is mandated by the State of Connecticut. The Results from this test is used to calculate Performance Index figures for each school and the district for the state's next generation accountability system.

Please be advised that in order to provide a secure testing environment all cell phones will be collected, turned off and stored in a secure area during the administration of the CAPT assessment.
