Leandra Begaye, GHS Principal provided a presentation on the Ganado Middle School Promotion.

Ms. Begaye shared the current promotion rate with 88 students above the 1.75 GPA requirement for them to promote and 27 students below the 1.75 GPA requirement for them to promote.

What will we do to make sure we get them back on track?

- Teachers have made attempts to speak with parents regarding their child's academic status.
- Letters have been prepared and sent.
- Teachers are available during lunch to provide one to one support.
- Extensions have been given to allow students to turn in assignments.
- Teachers review the assessment results.
- Teachers consult with students regularly to keep them current.
- After hour teaching, LIVE sessions and clarification provided for students when needed.
- LIVE sessions recorded in google classroom for students to revisit if they are having difficulty.
- Preparation of packets for students who lack internet access or who have been exposed to Covid, or have contracted it.

#### What are our plans?

- Teachers have made themselves available after working hours to provide support.
- Teachers have modified assignments.
- Teachers will continue to collaborate and communicate information on all students to ensure success for promotion.

Students not meeting the attendance criteria and/or GPA will attend summer school. Students who successfully complete summer school will earn their Certificate of Promotion.

# Ganado High School Graduation Rate and Recovery Plan Current Cohort population and grad rate – Seniors

- 141 Students
  - Cohort 2022 = 113
  - Cohort 2021 = 27
  - Cohort 2019 = 1
  - 8 students have graduated since July 2021.

#### On track to graduate in 2022

- 36 Seniors
- 35 Seniors have less than 5 Credit Recovery courses on Edgenuity and can get back on track.
- 2 Alternative Students will graduate within next few weeks.

#### Current Cohort Population and Grade Rate - Juniors

#### 110 Students

- 23 on track to graduate in 2023
- 38 students have less than 5 credit recovery courses in Edgenuity and can get back on track.
- 61 students on track to graduation = 55% graduation rate.

- 60 students have greater than 5 Credit Recovery courses in Edgenuity.
- Current 2022 cohort students are completing regular coursework as well.

# **GUSD Alternative Education Program**

Fall Semester 2021 – 46 students enrolled Spring Semester 2022 – 28 students enrolled

- Over 90% of current Alt. Ed. students are 5th year seniors (2021 cohort).
- · 3 students are 2020 cohort

- 1 student is 2019 cohort
- 3 are ESS, 1 is 504.
- Fall Semester 2021 = 8 graduates to date
- Spring Semester 2022 = 7 graduates anticipated
- SY 2021-2022 Alt. Ed. graduates anticipated = 15
- Summer 2022 = 6 additional graduates anticipated

Number of Courses Assigned and completed as 2of 2/7/2022 306 Courses Assigned 102 Courses Completed

It was noted that the numbers (graph) does not include courses completed by graduates (archived; reflects courses underway by current students.

#### Students struggle due to:

- Lack of mastery of foundational knowledge
- Lack of understanding of how to study to acquire knowledge (must practice to learn)
- Lack of close parent/guardian oversight of students' educational journey
- · Lack of technological/other supports in the home
- · Lack of confidence in personal ability based on prior failures
- Lack of motivation

# Struggles & Concerns

- Semester 1 students were on an A/B schedule and periods of remote learning that limited the amount of time for students to work on courses in school.
  - 2-3 days per week, with a total of about 30 in-class days
  - 40 minute class period
- Students have limited or no access to the Internet at home to continue working on classes.
- Students need to be self-motivated to work on their courses and make progress. Activity online goes down when not in school.
- The courses these students are enrolled in are courses they failed last year, when the district was on Remote Learning.
- Students have been asking for After-School Credit Recovery, as we held in previous years.

Mrs. Gorman leaves the meeting at 6:45 p.m.

Mr. Roanhorse recess the meeting due to a lack of a quorum while Mrs. Begay logs onto the zoom meeting at 6:35 p.m.

Mr. Roanhorse rescinds the meeting and reconvenes as Mrs. Begay joins the meeting at 6:36 p.m.

Ms. Kanuho did a ROLL CALL: Judy James, Wanda Begay and Marcarlo Roanhorse were present for a quorum to proceed with the meeting.

#### **Current Outreach**

- Credit Recovery courses have been added to Edgenuity since Semester 2 of their Freshman year and are updated each semester.
- 1st notice of non-graduate status (lacking 0.5 credit or more) was mailed to parents in September 2021.
- 2nd notice is pending mail out due to review of credits from Semester 1.
- Mass emails have been sent to students who have been added to Credit Recovery classes.
- Announcements throughout the year are made on Senior information page, in-classrooms, and one-on-one visits reminding students to work on Credit Recovery courses.
- Senior Teachers assist in providing time for counselors to share information with students.

#### **Solutions**

- Provide After-School Credit Recovery 2:30 PM 5:30 PM, with after-school bus runs or parent pick-up.
  - · Snacks for Students would be greatly appreciated
- 42 students are Juniors, Summer School in-person would benefit these students to complete their courses and get on track to graduate with their Cohort.
- Next school year, incorporate more Credit Recovery class periods in the Master Schedule. Allowing students to work on their courses in the regular school day.
  - Possible extension of school day to 7 periods.
- Teacher compensation to teach additional sections this year.

#### The Process - Edgenuity

- Within each course, there are about 4-7 units:
- · Within each unit, there are Lessons (number of lessons vary per course)
- For Credit Recovery Classes, students are given a pre-test to test out of the lesson. They would have to score 80% to demonstrate
  mastery of lesson.
- Each Lesson consists of:
  - Warm-Up
  - Instruction
  - Summary
  - Assignment
  - Quiz—students automatically get 3 attempts. If students need additional retakes, they will contact their teacher to assign additional retakes.
- There is a Unit Test at the end of each unit, which requires a teacher to unlock the activity
- Each course includes a Cumulative Exam, which requires a teacher to unlock the activity.
