



STAY AWAY FROM THE DANGER ZONES!

STOP the Spread of COVJD-19!

Do to the timeline of COVID-19 and the new Omicron variant, information on how long it takes to develop symptoms once exposed, and when an infected person is no longer contagious is a little confusing. If you or someone in your immediate household is showing signs or symptoms of an illness, please have your child stay at home. This will eliminate any possible exposer at the school.

Below is some information on the infection of COVID-19.

When do symptoms start after being exposed to COVID-19?

Symptoms usually appear 2 to 6 days after exposure to the virus. However, it sometimes takes longer — up to 14 days — so it is recommended you wear a mask and minimize close contact with others for at least 10 days after exposure.

Once exposed, how long does it take to be contagious?

A person with COVID-19 may be contagious 48 hours before starting to experience symptoms. This is why it's so important to quarantine if you think you were exposed to COVID-19 and get tested 4-5 days after exposure or 1 to 2 days after symptom onset. Sometimes a person may not experience symptoms at all. Yet, if they have been exposed, they could still be contagious and should follow the same protocol.

When is a person most contagious?

People are most contagious early in their infection, especially from 1 to 2 days before symptom onset and 3 to 4 days afterward.

How long is someone contagious?

The current data available show people with mild-to-moderate COVID-19 are much less likely to be infectious after 5 days from the start of symptoms, and very unlikely to be infectious by 10 days after the infection.

As school continues, GUSD will mitigate the possibility of exposure to staff/student. This mitigation process will have to start at home, for both our staff and students. So, If you or someone in your immediate house hold is showing signs or symptoms of an illness, please stay at home and get a COVID-19 test if needed.
