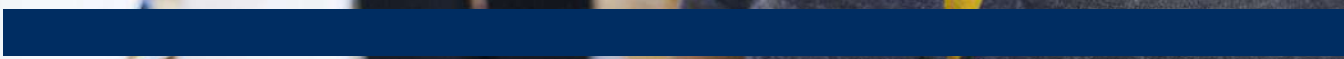




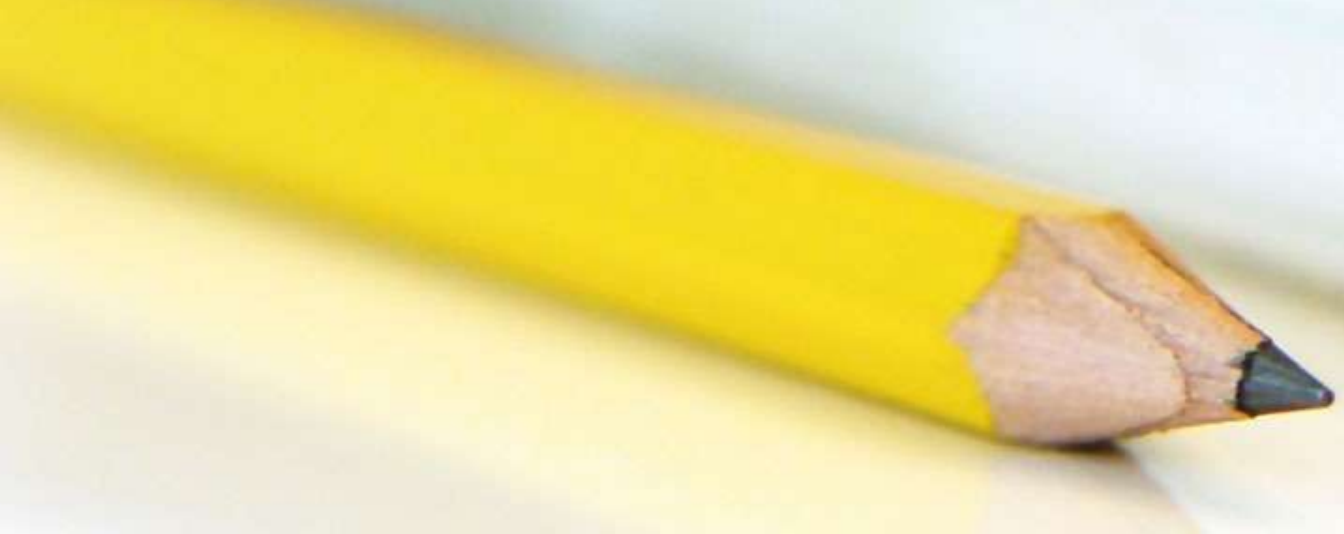




Who Does It Benefit ?

What is Measured ?

4 and above = Silver

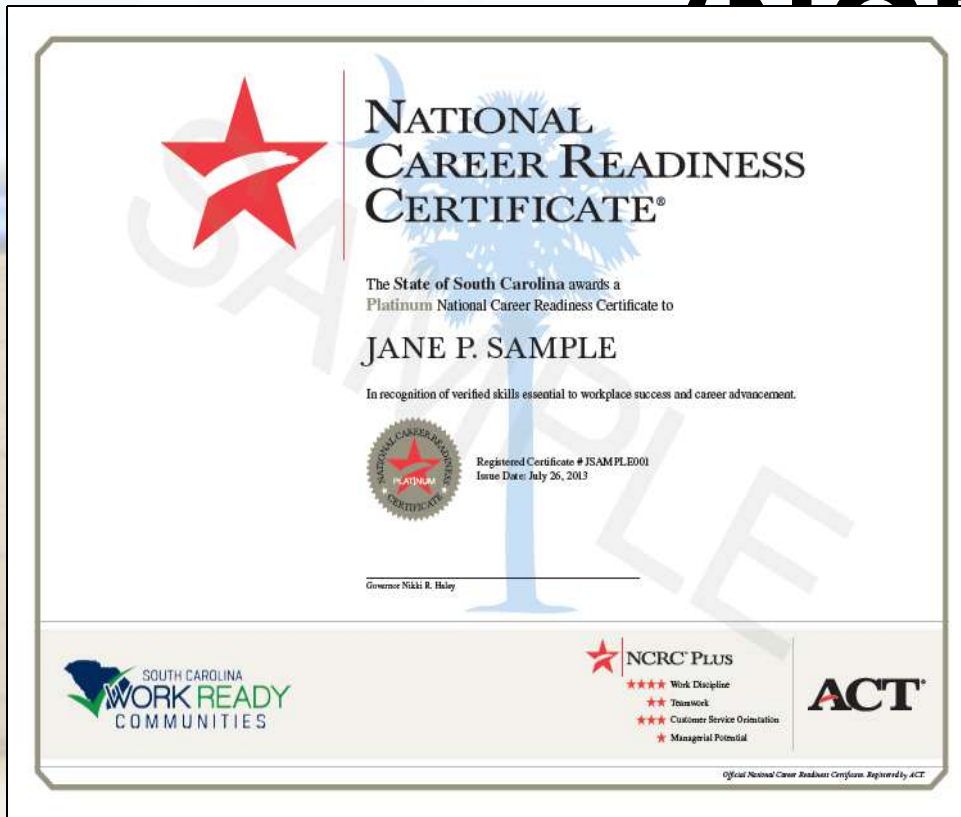
3 and above = Bronze
