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A MESSAGE FROM MRS. RAZZA, PRINCIPAL

I can't believe May is already here and the school year is quickly coming to an end! You should have received your child's report card for the 3rd marking period. If you have any questions, please reach out to your child's teacher. The last report card will be available on June 16th, the last day of school.

Attendance is still extremely important as we end the school year. A lot of learning goes on each day and the skills build on each other. For a strong foundation, it is essential for students to attend school daily.

Smarter Balanced testing will begin for students in grades 3,4 and 5 on Tuesday, May 11 and continue throughout the month. In addition, all students in grades kindergarten through grade 5 will be given end of the year assessments in math and reading. Please make sure your child comes to school every day! Below are some tips that can help your child do well on tests and help your child succeed!

Help Your Child Do Well On a Test:

- 1. Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep before every test.
- 2. Provide a light, healthy breakfast.
- 3. Have your child dress comfortably and arrive at school on time.
- 4. Send your child off to school with confidence-building words of praise and support: "You'll do great!" "Believe in yourself!" "I love you!"
- 5. Suggest that your child breathe deeply to relax before and during the test.
- 6. Remind your child to read directions carefully and look at all the answers before choosing one.
- 7. Tell your child to check his or her answers before submitting the test.
- 8. Do not schedule trips, dental or medical appointments, or early pickups for testing days.




A MESSAGE FROM MRS. POULTER PARENT LIAISON



A MESSAGE FROM MRS. CHIUCARELLO AND MISS DICKEY KINDERGARTEN

WOW, we can't believe it is May already! We have learned so much this year but still have so much more to learn, so make sure you come to school everyday ready to learn. In May, we will start learning about digraphs in Fundations. Your child may have started to see these already in Unit 4 or in small groups. We will continue our close reads in Wonders with questions to answer after the readings. In math, we are learning how to make a teen number out of a group of ten and some ones. Students will use ten rods and ones to help understand this concept. In May, students will complete their end of the year mCLASS testing and math testing. For students at home, please make sure you have a quiet area at home where you can concentrate. In May, we will also start an ABC Countdown! Each day will be a different letter and we have fun activities planned for each day. Before you know it, it will be June! We can't wait to learn with your child as we come to the end of Kindergarten.



A MESSAGE FROM MRS. DEMOLLARI AND MISS WOJTUNIK FIRST GRADE

May is already here and our first graders are counting down the days till the end of the year. Being in school everyday until the last day of school is our goal. May is an important month because mCLASS testing and iReady Diagnostic will take place. Those tests will show students' performance and their progress.

Students will learn new vocabulary and high frequency words in Wonders. In Math, students will learn that adding or subtracting a number that is a multiple of ten (10, 20, 30, etc.) can be thought of as adding or subtracting a number of tens (1 ten, 2 tens, 3 tens, etc.) In Fundations, students will continue to learn about multisyllable words. Lastly, in science we will be learning how plants and animals respond to changes in their environment. The unit will end with a selfcheck and a unit review.

May is here! We are counting down the days as the end of school is quickly approaching. Our second graders are working hard getting their Amplify Reading minutes and i-Ready Math minutes done daily (20 minutes every day).

Our last two assessments will be coming up soon: mCLASS End-Of-Year Assessment - May 11 - May 21st Math Diagnostic End-Of-Year Assessment - May 25 - May 28th

Students should have a quiet area to work during these assessments. They will need scrap paper and pencil to do the work during their math diagnostic. These assessments show students progress and growth for the school year.

In Fundations, we are starting our last unit and reviewing all of the other units from our trick words, vowel sounds, practicing marking our words, reading and writing sentences. In math, we are working on comparing lengths and 2 step word problems. In science, we are working on Unit 6, Objects and Patterns in the Sky. In reading, we are starting Unit 6 in Wonders. We will still be working on comprehension strategies and skills when reading our stories.

We have less than a month of school left. Keep working hard! We got this!

A MESSAGE FROM MR. MITCHELL AND MRS. SCHMIED THIRD GRADE


