## **Resources for Parents - Online Education**

Montezuma-Cortez School District RE-1 is providing in-person learning. In the event the pandemic causes mandates that restrict in-person learning, our district will move to complete remote learning. Parents who wish to have their child(ren) learn from home may choose options below:

### **Elementary:**

If parents wish for their student to remain connected to the district schools, they may also choose to enroll in the remote option of viewing the classes daily from home. It would be the parent and child's responsibility to get online daily and attend classes. This is referred to as a "synchronous" method of learning. Please discuss this option with the administration of your school.

## **Secondary:**

The Southwest Colorado eSchool (SWCeS) and Montezuma-Cortez School District RE-1 have partnered to offer a full-time online schooling option for 6th-12th graders. SWCeS is an accredited regional, diploma granting online high school serving the communities of Southwest Colorado. SWCeS is a tuition free online school available to students in grades 6-12. Students enrolled in SWCeS engage in rigorous courses aligned to Colorado standards taught by licensed Colorado teachers. All courses are offered through the Internet with students participating at a distance from their home or another Internet access point. In addition to individual course instructors students have access to content area tutors, remote learning activities and various other support structures.

Through our partnership with district students attending can maintain their connection with their school community and continue to participate in school activities. We work closely with administrators, counselors and school staff with the Montezuma-Cortez School District throughout the year to ensure that students are supported and growing.

### **Enrollment and Registration**

Students may participate in SWCeS courses starting at the beginning of any academic term. Enrollment forms and information can be found on the school's website. All students who are new to SWCeS courses will complete a short Introduction to Online learning course before beginning classwork.

## **Independent Learning Option Separate from the District:**

Parents also have the option to manage their child's education completely on their own through a myriad of resources and online educational opportunities. The information provided below will help guide parents through this option. The district is not a partner with the other online public schools and would not be able to provide support.

### How do I enroll my student in an online school or program?

Most online schools will have their own specific steps for enrollment. However, online schools typically require the same documents as a brick-and-mortar school such as a birth certificate, proof of residency, immunization records, and prior school records if applicable. You will need to be a resident of the state of Colorado for enrollment in a multi-district school. If you are enrolling in a single district school/program, you will need to be a resident of the school district that the school or program operates in.

#### How do I choose an online school?

Since there are many types of online schools and programs, exploring what each one has to offer is a great place to start. Make sure the school offers the grade level you require. Some schools serve grades only K-8, others K-12 and some only serve middle school and/or high school age students. In addition to different grades levels, each online school may have a different focus. Some schools serve at-risk students and may offer credit recovery for high school age students who need to catch up on credits to graduate. Other schools may serve elementary and/ or middle school age students in a more traditional model or are college preparatory. The manner of instructional delivery may also vary. Some schools may offer face to face services in addition to the online portion of their program, while others deliver instruction strictly through the computer while the student is at home. Many schools hold informational meetings that you can attend, either online or in person to get more information about their program.
