

## SUMMER SCHOOL 2010

Review & Enrichment Courses For Elementary, Middle & High School

> <u>Location</u>: Lyman Hall High School 70 Pond Hill Road Wallingford, CT 06492

<u>Date</u>: Thursday, July 8, 2010 through Friday, August 6, 2010



## **PURPOSE**

The Wallingford Summer School is a program of educational opportunities and experiences authorized by the Wallingford Board of Education. The Summer School program includes review courses for students who have failed or achieved poorly during the regular school year and enrichment courses that supplement the regular school program.

### **TYPES OF COURSES**

<u>Review Courses</u>: Students may remove a failure in a course by successfully completing the summer session, by adhering to the attendance policy and all other rules, and by passing the final examination. Students may also take a review course to improve a grade to meet a course prerequisite, but the grade earned during the school year will remain the grade of record.

- 1. Full-year Course -- Minimum Requirements for Enrolling:
  - a. A student at the <u>high school level</u> attempting to correct an academic failure or a loss of credit in a full-year course must either have received a passing grade in two marking periods and passed either the mid-year exam or the final exam <u>or</u> have a yearly average of at least 50%.
  - b. At the <u>middle school level</u> the student must have passed at least two marking periods <u>or</u> have a yearly average of at least 50%.
- 2. Half-year Course -- Minimum Requirements for Enrolling:

A student at the <u>high school level</u> attempting to correct an academic failure or a loss of credit in a half-year course must have received a passing grade in one marking period <u>or</u> have earned a grade of 50% or better as the course average.

Wallingford Summer School is responsible for the supervision and evaluation of students. Credit will be granted to the student and forwarded to his/her principal for acceptance only after the student achieves a passing grade in the program.

<u>Enrichment Courses</u>: Students may take a course which they have not taken previously for the purpose of obtaining background or because they have a special interest in the course. Enrichment courses must be taken on a noncredit basis.

## **NUMBER OF COURSES**

A student attempting to correct academic failure or loss of credit may remediate a maximum total of 2.0 credits at the high school level or 2 full-year courses at the middle school level in all summer programs whether taken in or out of the district. If a student is making up Algebra 1, a total of 2.5 credits may be earned.

## **PROCEDURES AND REGULATIONS**

<u>Attendance Policy</u>: Summer school consists of five classes a week and a student is expected to attend all class sessions of each course in which the student is enrolled. Time lost from class is essentially irretrievable in terms of opportunity for instructional interaction. Therefore, the following policy shall be in effect:

1. <u>Absences</u> :	No more than two (2) days of absences will be allowed. Loss of credit in the course will result on the third absence.
2. Absence for Illness	Must be medically corroborated.
3. <u>Tardies</u> :	Three (3) tardies to class will constitute (1) absence.
4. Missed Work:	All work missed due to absence must be made up.
5. Vacation Time:	No vacation time will be granted during a summer session.

<u>Credit</u>: Students in grades 6-12 shall be eligible to receive credit for review courses provided they earn a passing grade and adhere to the attendance policy. However, students who have already earned credit in the course and are taking the course again for prerequisite purposes will not be granted additional credit. Enrichment courses are taken on a noncredit basis only. No official grades or credit will be given to students in grades 1-5; however, a report of the work accomplished will be sent to the parents of each student.

<u>Smoking Policy</u>: No smoking is permitted in school buildings or on school grounds. Violators may lose their right to attend summer school and forfeit their registration fees.

<u>Transportation</u>: No transportation of students is supplied; however, every effort will be made to make lists available to students to enable them to join car pools.

<u>Cell Phone Policy</u>: Students may possess cellular telephones while they are in school, but the telephones must be turned off and out of sight during class sessions. They may be used at the conclusion of classes to coordinate transportation home.
