 - Teachers are available after school 3:15-3:30 daily.
 - Teachers are available for conferences during planning period. (Call office for available times.)
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - Open door policy- Parents MUST come by main office to check in as a visitor
 - Utilizing parent volunteers to assist teachers. Examples: during art work, reading, speaking on different subjects or sharing on career choice/hobbies
