



A SUMMARY OF THE MPS PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY 2022-2023

What is Title I?

Title I is the nation's largest assistance program for schools that provides supplemental resources to economically disadvantaged schools to support the achievement of its students. It is a federal program to help all students get a good education and meet academic standards.

Title I funds are used to upgrade the entire school's educational program so that the overall education of ALL children who attend the school can be improved. All children enrolled in a Title I school, including those with disabilities and with limited English proficiency, are eligible to receive Title I services.

HOW WILL MPS BUILD CAPACITY FOR PARENTS?

- ◆ Title I schools will host an Annual Title I meeting for parents by the end of October.
- ◆ Parents will be invited to serve on school committees such as the Parent Advisory Council and the Annual Continuous Improvement Plan (ACIP).
- ♦ Title I schools will have regular parent meetings at various times.
- ♦ Parents may request from the school information about their child's teacher's qualifications
- ◆ Title I schools will distribute information in a language parents can understand using a variety of methods including newsletters, flyers, the school website, and the automated phone system.
- ♦ Title I schools will offer workshops for parents that will cover a variety of issues that may include, but will not be limited to assessments, academic assistance, behavior modification strategies, mental health awareness, and many others.

Goals of Title I

- ⇒ Increase student academic achievement
- ⇒ Provide direct instructional support to students
- ⇒ Provide professional development to teachers
- ⇒ Promote parent education and engagement in school activities

How Will Title I Help My Child?

If your child qualifies for help, the Title I Program will provide additional educational assistance beyond the regular classroom. In most cases, these services may include all or some of the following:

- ·Smaller classes or special instructional areas
- ·Additional teachers or instructional assistants
- ·Opportunities for professional development for school staff
- •Extra time for teaching Title I students the skills they need
- •Extended day academic and enrichment services
- •An individualized program for students
- ·Additional teaching materials for the regular instructional program
