- Budget your time. Do not spend too much time on any one question since there is a time limit for completing the test.
- Read each question carefully. Never assume you know what a question is asking until you've read it in it's entirety.
- **Practice, practice, practice!** Let us say it one more time. Practice, practice, practice! There is no substitute for



UNDERSTANDING YOUR ACT WORKKEYS ASSESSMENTS SCORES

Your score is determined by the number of questions answered correctly. There is no penalty for guessing. The Level Scores describe the skills you have achieved and can apply on the job or in training. After taking the assessments, you will receive a

score report. If you take the ACT WorkKeys assessments on a computer, you will receive an Individual Score Report. This report documents your skill level for each assessment taken and describe the tasks associated with each skill level.

ACT WORKKEYS SCORE REPORTS

Your report may be slightly different from those shown here, depending on how and where you took the test, but all of the essential elements are the same.

- 1 TEST is the name of the ACT WorkKeys test you took.
- 2 LEVEL SCORE is the score you earned on this test.
- Approved the sample of the sam
- SCALE SCORE is used primarily for training purposes to track growth.

MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR ACT WORKKEYS SCORES

If you already have a job in mind, compare your Level Scores to those needed for your target job. For instance, look at sample report and compare it to the scores needed for the occupation below.

Accountant/ Auditor	5	5	5

This job requires a score of Level 5 for Graphic Literacy, so achieving a Level 6 shows you have the foundational skills for this job. If you take Applied Math and Workplace Documents as well, you will receive score reports and could compare those assessments to the levels required for this job.
