CAPSTONE EXPERIENCE

Capstone is a culminating activity that allows students to demonstrate their knowledge and skills through a personalized project focused on an interest, career plan, or academic pursuit.

CT CERTIFICATE OF GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT

Students are eligible to earn this certificate, which will be indicated on the student transcript, based on coursework, activities, and a culminating project.

SEAL OF BILITERACY

Beginning with the Class of 2019, the Seal of Biliteracy recognizes students who are literate and lingual in more than one language (with a proficiency at the intermediate-mid range).

CLASS RANK

Beginning with the Class of 2019 and subsequent classes, final class rank will be based on the cumulative GPA of six semesters (calculated at the conclusion of the junior year). Quality points are granted according to the level of the course and the mark earned except for pass/fail courses and P.E. Quality point averages are determined by dividing the quality points earned by total credit value of the quality point courses taken. Only students who have attended Sheehan for six semesters are ranked. All other students who enter after the completion of the first semester of sophomore year are co-ranked. All students are ranked on a 4.0 weighted scale with AP and Honors courses given a higher weight.
