WHAT WE TEACH

Newark City Schools teaches curricula tied to and defined by the Ohio's Learning Standards, which outline performance expectations for students in the strands of reading, writing, language, and speaking and listening.

Our ninth-grade program provides a literary survey, while our tenth-grade program focuses on world literature, our eleventh-grade program on American literature, and our twelfth on British literature.

HOW WE TEACH IT

We deliver responsive, flexible instruction based on learner needs. Teachers pre-assess students to determine core competencies and then focus their instruction on areas for growth. Within our English language arts classes, students receive instruction in vocabulary, speaking and listening, close reading, and the art of writing.

Over the course of the program, students study a variety of complex texts and seminal works, fiction and non-fiction, selected for their richness, relevance, and literary, historical, and/or cultural significance. Literature is broad in spectrum, ensuring texts reflect a mind-expanding assortment of diverse opinions and experiences.
