- 3. Label the following parts of the brain:
 - a. Cerebrum
 - i. Frontal lobe
 - ii. Parietal lobe
 - iii. Temporal lobe
 - iv. Occipital lobe
 - b. Cerebellum
 - c. Brain stem
 - i. Midbrain
 - ii. Pons
 - iii. Medulla oblongata
- 4. Describe the functions associated with each of the brain structures listed above.
