#### Special Education Notes....

Even though we are all hoping that winter weather is behind us, the Special Education Office wanted to provide a reminder regarding weather events and Planning and Placement Team (PPT) meetings.

If school is cancelled PPT meetings are "cancelled" and rescheduled. The Special Education Office will contact you with new possible dates and times.

If there is a delayed opening or early dismissal any meeting scheduled during the window when school is not in session is "cancelled" and rescheduled.

For example, if your meeting is scheduled for 9:15 at the high school and there is a delay which moves the start of school until 9:35, your meeting would not be held as scheduled.

Please remember that offices are also delayed or dismissed during weather events.



### UPDATES FROM OUR TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Griswold Public Schools had its first Technology for Seniors Day on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. GHS senior students volunteered to be paired with community senior citizens to help them with their technological devices.

We were told to expect 7 seniors and we ended up with almost double (thank you Marc Cote for more chairs). The senior citizens were instructed to bring any type of technological device with which they needed help. We saw everything from flip phones to new laptops. Seniors were asking for help from learning how to text their children and grandchildren to opening a Facebook account so that they could reach out to relatives in other parts of the country.

Our senior citizens worked well with their GHS assistants. We had previously chatted with the students to see what strengths and skills each had, and students were paired with seniors based on the needs of the senior citizen. This enabled the students to feel very comfortable and resulted in each person getting one-to-one support. Because we ended up with more senior citizens than anticipated, members of the technology department (thank you Kyle and Lisa) helped out. Afterwards, the seniors had coffee and dessert courtesy of the culinary program. Our senior citizens left very excited and many said they were coming back with other technological devices that they have at home and they just don't know how to use. Everyone had a great time and the students were exceptional!!!!


