Important Notice

Note form the Health Office:

The school district cannot take responsibility for medications at school over the summer, and by policy, we cannot send medications home with a student.

That leaves three options for these medications:

- You can come by the school now and pick up all the medications your child will be unable to use before the last day of school leaving us with just the right number of doses.
- 2. You can come and pick up the medications prior to or on the last day of school before 11:00 AM. Wednesday May 28th (field day) is a great time to stop in and pick up medications. The last day is a half-day and generally no medications will be given that day.
- 3. Leave medications at school and we will dispose of them at the end of the school day the last day of school.



Odyssey of the Mind Team is Going to the World **Finals**

After six months of practice for 3 to 5 hours a week, the Namaqua Seeing is **Believing Odyssey**



Team has been invited to attend the 35th annual World Finals in Ames, Iowa at the end of May. They competed in Regionals and State, and will now be competing against approximately 100 teams in their age division from around the world. The team consists of Avalon Hart, Robin Bilodeau, Ashley Campbell, Brooke Wagner, Mallory Phillips, and Natalia Brizuela-Wahlin.

Who participates in Odyssey of the Mind?

"Millions of students from kindergarten through college have participated in the Odyssey of the Mind. Since the Odyssey of the Mind eliminates the fear of criticism, even shy students are afforded the opportunity to open up and express themselves. Students learn to work in teams. Each year, five new competitive problems are presented for the teams to solve. These long-term problems are solved over weeks and months. Some of the problems are more technical in nature, while others are artistic or performance based. Each long-term problem rewards "Style" in the solution. This helps teach students that they should not simply try to solve problems but take the next step of enhancing their solutions. The teams are invited to participate in competition and present their solution with other teams. At the competition, the teams are given an on-the-spot "spontaneous" problem to solve. The combination of long-term problem-solving, Style, and spontaneous problem-solving produces a confident, able student." -Odyssey of the Mind web site: http://www.odvssevofthemind.com/ learn more.php
