Non-resident Attendance

Non-resident students are defined as those whose parents or legal guardians reside outside the geographical limits of Brookfield.

The Brookfield Public Schools exist to serve the residents of Brookfield. The Brookfield Board of Education recognizes that certain circumstances warrant consideration of non-residents as students.

The Board may approve requests for school attendance in the district for children living outside the district only for the reasons specifically listed herein:

- 1. When a child resides in the district on a 24-hour/day basis during the academic week on a non-paid basis.
- 2. When the mental or physical health of the child is a consideration as certified by a physician, school psychologist, or other appropriate school personnel.
- 3. When the parents have moved out of the district during the school year and the students wishes to complete the year.
- 4. On a student-for-student basis when equal numbers of students transfer between two districts.
- 5. When the district of origin or the parent/guardian agrees to pay the cost per student of education in the district less state and federal apportionments.
- 6. When the class enrollments in the district will permit the addition of out-of-district students, on a space available basis, in order to improve academic achievement of the student and/or to reduce racial, ethnic and economic isolation or preserve racial and ethnic balance.

Transportation beyond that normally provided for students living in the district shall not be provided for students attending on an inter-district attendance agreement.

The Brookfield Board of Education reserves the right to accept or reject any request for enrollment by a non-resident, to determine placement of said student, and to unilaterally terminate the enrollment of said student.
