

AP CONTRACT

Commitment Code: Students wishing to take AP courses are expected to make <u>a year long commitment</u> to complete each year long course.

AP is an opportunity...

Norco High School's goal is to provide opportunities and support to our students to help them be successful in AP courses. AP courses are structured to engage and challenge students at a higher level.

 AP courses require more individual study time per week than a regular class. Students will need to read and prepare <u>outside of class</u> to participate effectively in classroom discussions and activities. STUDY TIMES WILL VARY, BUT BEING SELF-MOTIVATED, AT HOME, IS A CRUCIAL COMPONENT IN BEING SUCCESSFUL IN AN AP COURSE.

- Due to workload, students should consider taking three or fewer AP courses at one time.
- Before enrolling in an AP course, students need to review the course syllabus. These are available on the Norco High website under AP Testing.
- Students may be required to complete an AP Summer Assignment. Students will not be allowed to drop the course due to not completing summer assignment. Students must contact each AP teacher or visit the Norco High website prior to leaving for summer vacation for summer assignment verification.

INTERVENTION CHECKLIST:

Any student wishing to drop an AP course after the drop deadline will:

- ☐ Attend class regularly (is not frequently absent or tardy)
- ☐ Actively seek help from teacher before school, lunch, and/or after school
- ☐ Complete steps indicated in the AP Support document including teacher signature.
