### We are back from camp!!




### **VHEC Students and Sloths**

### Vestavia Hills Elementary Central's Maker Space

The Vestavia Hills City Schools Foundation, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, provides funds each year to Vestavia Hills educators for technology improvements, classroom enhancement projects, and professional development training for teachers. In 2015-16 the Foundation awarded more than \$55,000 in grants including a grant to Vestavia Hills Elementary Central to fund a Maker Space.





Vestavia Hills Elementary Central transformed its computer lab into an innovative 21st century learning space, Central PARK (Positive Atmosphere Reaches Kids). VHEC integrated a Maker Space area which provided a setting where the Next Generation Science Standards can be implemented with greater ease.

The objective was to develop scientifically literate students who understand and who can apply core ideas in each of the major science disciplines. Because of the VHCSF grant, students have could incorporate science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) concepts while exploring hands-on, creative problem solving in our Maker Spaces.

Since providing its first grants in 1999, the VHCSF has awarded \$784,000 to Vestavia Hills City Schools and the Board of Education. The Foundation's endowment is funded by contributions from parents, grandparents, and other community-minded residents and companies who want to ensure Vestavia schools have access to funds for educational improvements.
