ROTC ADVENTURE TEAM WINS STATE

Trevor Browne captured the statewide JROTC Adventure Team competition, taking the lead on the first weekend and finishing off the field October 5, at Maryvale. Trevor Browne led after six events at Camp Raymond in Flagstaff September 27-29 where the Rappelling, One Rope Bridge, Land Navigation, Leadership Reaction Course, Rope Climb and Endurance events took place. In Phase II, the Physical Fitness Challenge, the Rattlers team took first place in Push-ups, Pull-ups and the Canal run. The fitness challenge also had a one-mile run and a shuttle relay. It is the fifth time in six years Browne has won this event, after Maryvale won last year. Each event is made up of eight male cadets and two female cadets, selected from 14 team members. **Marco Rodriguez** paced the Rattlers with 69 push-ups and 21 pull-ups in one minute, and female cadet **Flerida Quintero** led TGB with 59 sit-ups. Maryvale was second and Flowing Wells third in the 14-team field. Carl Hayden placed fourth, Alhambra, fifth. Trevor Browne is coached by JROTC instructor First Sergeant **Noah Tincher**.

Alan Soto is pictured with Dr. Trujillo and 1st Sergeant Jurczak receiving the Civilian Marksmanship Expert Badge which took him three years to earn. Soto had to shoot and place in both regional and national competitions. He is currently ranked in the top 10 marksmen in the country. Only a handful of other marksmen from the valley have previously earned this award. Alan is the 1st from TGB.

The team is also doing very well, having just won the Carver Mountain Match. In November they will compete in the Governor's Cup and then they will go to New Mexico in February for regionals. Sgt. Jurczak says this is the best team he has ever coached and fully expects them to qualify for Nationals which will take place in Alabama. Soto qualified individually last year for Nationals and is expected to do so again. In order to go to Alabama, due to federal budget cuts, the JROTC will have to pay all of the expenses. 
- 1. The clinic is open from 8:30am-4:30pm Monday, Wednesday and Thursday each week.
