

Soon after signing, Lisa joined the cast of iLuminate and performed with them on "Six Flags Over Georgia". She then moved to New York, where she continued with iLuminate's "Artist of Light". She is also a member of iLuminate's World Tour Corporate cast. In addition to her performance work with iLuminate since 2012, Lisa is also a choreographer and master teacher extraordinaire.

Daniel Amoros - (House Head) Born and raised in the Bronx, New York, Danny began his dancing career at the age of 19. He has been in the NY crew – DSolez/ Rhythm City – and professional dance scene ever since, and has been with iLuminate for the past 2+ years. Through the art of dance, he has been able to tour various cities within the U.S., as well as countries such as China, New Zealand, Switzerland, to name a few. Danny's most recent travel through dance, took him on a tour with iLuminate to 2 different cities in Saudi Arabia!
