A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Dear RMS Parents,

Two weeks ago, I sent an email to all our parents notifying you that Parentvue would look a bit different that it has in the past. I'd like to explain a bit more about the Parentvue and grading situation at RMS. Currently, when you log in to Parentvue, there is not an averaged "Total Grade" for the courses.

Why is the total grade missing for my child? We recognize the importance of reporting accurate and timely information to you regarding your child's progress in school. Partially through first quarter, it became clear to us that our grading program was computing the averages incorrectly in many cases. This caused a lot of unnecessary stress and miscommunication for everyone involved. As a solution we chose to take the total grade off of Parentvue, instead parents and students can look at the specific grades for each assignment according to standard.

When logging into Parentvue, what will I see and how do I know how my child is doing? Next to each course, where the total grade use to be, you will now see an NA. Click on this NA and you will see a complete progress report for your child. Click on each Standard to see the assignments associated with that standard. This view is actually a much more accurate and more thorough picture of your child's progress.

What grade will my child have at the end of the quarter?

Total grades are the same as they have been in the past. Students are still receiving a final grade at the end of each quarter. This final grade will be a reflection of the student's body of work for the quarter.

How long will the total content grade not be on Parent Vue?

We hope that this is temporary. However, the total grade will not be on Parent Vue until we are certain that the information is being reported to you accurately. Our district leaders are working on this situation and we hope to get it resolved.

I sincerely hope that this answers any questions you might have surrounding the Parentvue issues. As always, feel free to contact your child's teacher with any specific questions related to a particular class. If you have any questions or comments please contact me.

Announcing the 2018 Hawaiian Discovery Field Trip. You are invited to attend an FYI meeting on Tuesday, August 29 at 6:00 PM in the cafeteria. It is the same agenda for the meeting last spring.

The Trip is a 9 – day learning adventure which allows students the opportunity to *experience* Hawaii from a scientific perspective. The Big Island provides an ideal setting for students to *discover* firsthand the dynamic interaction of sun, sea, and volcano which created a diverse collection of tropical ecosystems.


It is an academic trip. Lessons are conducted on an on-going basis as we encounter various aspects of terrestrial ecosystem biology, geology, marine biology, and other related science topics. In addition, the cultural history of Hawaii is a natural extension of the coursework.

We camp the entire trip at county and National Park campgrounds. Students are responsible for all of the camping skills – pitching tents, cooking meals on a backpack –style stove, etc.

The trip is open to next year's 8th graders and students from other schools may apply. It costs \$2475 (additional costs may include purchasing items like snorkeling gear and some camping gear). \$300 non-refundable deposits and applications are required. Space is limited.
