
Library Media Center Happenings

The Library Media Center is off to a strong start this year! We have already had our 1,000th student. Earlier this month, Marissa became the 1,000th person to use the LMC during a study hall. Another exciting happening (at least, in my opinion) was that over 200 new titles were added to our library collection this Fall. The books include a diverse mix of genres and characters and have already begun to attract readers. Also new to the LMC this year was the inclusion of a multi-player chess game. Students and faculty have been taking turns making the next move on the board as they pass through the media center. Connor and everyone who made a move with a red piece were the winners of our first game.



The biggest change in our LMC this year was the addition of our new Makerspace. Over the summer some of the shelves were removed, and the first phase of the Makerspace was completed. Students have the opportunity to use the space before and after school or during study halls to learn new skills and showcase their creativity with the resources available. The most popular items to use have been the 3D printer, 3D pens, finger knitting yarn, sewing machine, and button maker. Classes have also been coming in to use the space and the materials. Ms. Collins' Fantasy literature class created cards in Elvish and Dwarven to correlate with their reading of *Lord of the Rings*. Ms. Croteau's class designed personal collages to compliment writing pieces, and Ms. Meyer's classes made buttons with French sayings. The next step will be the roll out of the new laptops, which will give students more coding and graphic design opportunities.

Interact Club Helps With Meal Prep for Local Food Banks

On Saturday, October 5th, members of the Somers High School Interact Club worked with people from seven different Rotary Clubs in the area to help assemble packaged meals for local food banks. The team worked on measuring and weighing ingredients, sealing packages, and boxing up meals. Over 21,500 servings of pasta with tomato sauce and apple cinnamon oatmeal were prepared, some of which will go to the food pantry here in Somers. Interact also helped the Friends of the Somers Public Library set up and organize for the Fall book sale at the beginning of October.
