FROM OUR SCHOOL NURSES' OFFICE

Mandated Hearing and Vision Screening

Beginning October 17th hearing and vision screenings will be taking place at Tolland Intermediate School.

Students will have vision screenings performed with a 20-second scan via the PediaVision scanner as performed by a trained Tolland Lions Club member. This screening is capable of screening for astigmatism, nearsightedness, farsightedness, lazy eye, misalignment of the eyes and pupil size anomalies. Students who wear glasses will be tested with their glasses on.

The scanner is held 3 feet away from children so there is no direct physical contact. All of the screening is also done in the presence of the school nurse.

For any student who screens outside of normal, a printout and referral letter will be sent home. For students currently under care for vision, this printout can be provided at their next exam.

For hearing screening, students will be screened by the nurse. Any student who does not pass initial hearing screening will be rescreened by the RN prior to a referral letter being sent home.

If Tolland Intermediate School nurses already have information that your child is followed by a hearing or vision specialist, they will not be screened at school unless you request a screening.

NO permission form is needed for screenings, but if you <u>do not want</u> your student to be screened for hearing and vision at school, please submit the attached opt out form to your school nurse no later than October 14, 2022.

FROM OUR READING DEPARTMENT:

T.I.S. Reading Reminder to Fall Back with Read Alouds!

Fall is a great time to get back into curling up with your favorite seasonal beverage and a good book.

Reading aloud to your child not only helps to **strengthen his/her listening, thinking and verbal skills**; it also helps to **create** warm childhood **memories** and some face to face family bonding away from the glaring blue light of a screen.

Become your child's personal fluency model.

Make your reading sound like talking.

Modulate your voice to thrill and engage their attention.

Give the characters different voices.

Act out a scene together! Ham it up. Add expression.

Encourage verbal skills and help your child to visualize!

Remind them to make movies in their minds and then stop to talk about how they pictured the characters and what they saw in the "movie in their minds".

Create attentive active thinkers.

Stop at different intervals and ask, "What are you thinking?"

Ask them what they think about what you've just read.

Review some wordless picture books and talk about the clues in the pictures.

Read some nonfiction together and explore new places and topics. Don't let the fleeting light and warmth of summer chill *your* bones. Grab a mug of hot pumpkin apple cider latte, make some great family memories and turn your child into a reader who ultimately prefers the book to the movie and your living room as their very own adventureland.

Autumnal delights for consideration:

Take a trip to the Public Library and choose some fall themed books. The librarians will have many suggestions and displays.

Reading comprehension depends not just on decoding skills but on vocabulary and background knowledge too. Parents play a key role in exposing their children to lots of language and information. That said, there are some specific things parents and caregivers can do to help develop a child's phonemic awareness. "Reading nursery rhymes and poetry, singing rhyming songs can be very helpful to developing a child's ear for listening to and noticing patterns of rhyming and alliteration in oral language," Dodson said. She also suggested doing things like comparing and contrasting the sounds in words. For example, ask your child which word doesn't belong in groups of words such as: mat/pat/cat/man or mat/man/mop/sat.

"Play around with words," Cassidy said. You can do listening games where you have your child take away syllables or sounds, she said. "For example, say 'plate.' Now say 'plate,' but don't say /p/. What's left?"

There are nonprofit organizations that provide specific resources. Several people recommended Reading Rockets, a public media initiative to provide information on how young children learn to read. The website includes several helpful tip sheets including Activities to Encourage Speech and Language Development, Playing with Word Sounds, and <a href="Making Friends with Phonemes. Wasowicz recommended Beginning with Babble, a free mobile phone app that gives parents daily tips and activities matched to the age of their child. Several people also suggested Understood, a nonprofit that focuses specifically on children with learning and attention issues. On the website, you can answer a few questions about your child and get customized information and suggestions for things to do and places to go for help. There is also this useful guide, A Child Becomes a Reader, from the National Institute for Literacy.





Introduction:

Tolland Travel Basketball is an organization that provides increased opportunities and training for girls to become competitive basketball players. Girls will gain a foundation of skills and understanding of the game so they can continue playing in high school and beyond.

Commitment:

The player's experience will depend on the level of commitment they give to practices and games. Please do your best to attend as often as possible in order to have prepared and competitive teams.

- ★ November-February (some teams make the playoffs extending into Morch).
- ★ practice 2 times a week for around 75 mins each practice.
 - All practices will take place at a Tolland School
- ★ 1-2 sames on the weekend (mostly 1)
 - Most games are within a 20-minute drive. The farthest is 40.
- ★ Preseason tournament in November

Ages/Teams:

Girls in grade level 5-8: Advanced 4th graders can also tryout. Every season, the number of teams that Tolland fields depend on the number of girls that sign up. Typically, each grade level has one team; however, there have been many years in which two grade levels combine for one team. It is also possible that one grade level has multiple teams.

Selectivity/Cuts:

As mentioned above, every season is different. Coaches will evaluate players each fall, make thoughtful decisions, and have conversations with each family regarding the outcomes/decisions made.

Cost:

Each year, the cost varies (typically between \$200-300) depending on the needs of that team (i.e. jerseys, team warm up sweatshirts, etc.). We typically buy jerseys/gear in 2 year cycles so that what you buy is used for two years, and then another set is bought 2 years later (5th & 7th grade being the most typical purchase cycles). Fees also cover our cost for referees, gym rentals, league fees, and team equipment. Please bring a check, made out to Tolland Travel Basketball, on the first day of tryouts. If your child is not selected, your check will be returned or destroyed.
