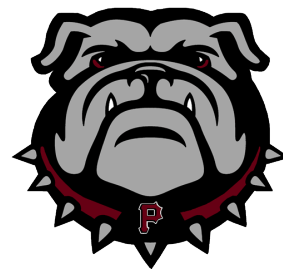

 - Must [sign-up online](#), registering with a cohort (pods of 50 people)

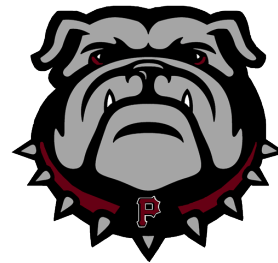
In my last communication, we also announced the return of Football! Below is a copy of the Varsity schedule.

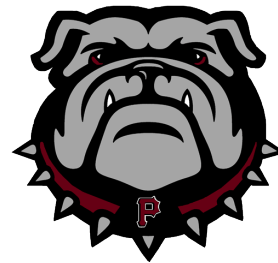

FREE COLLEGE APP WEEK-October 19-25

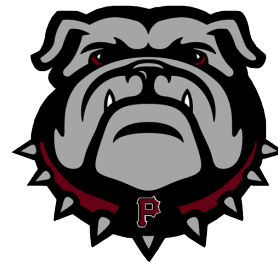

If you add colleges you are thinking about to your Naviance list, you will get an automatic invitation to meet with that college's rep when/if they visit PHS. PHS Students and Families,

The Spring 2020 SAT and PSAT exams would have taken place last April, but were cancelled. This year, we will hold SAT and PSAT exams twice—once this Fall, as a make-up and once in the Spring, as we always do.

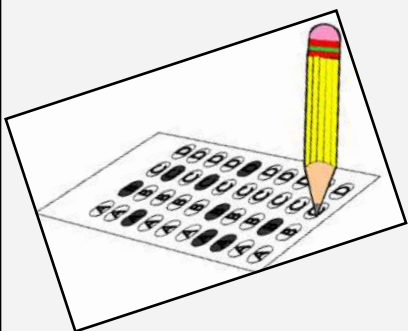
The make-up SAT for all Seniors is Wednesday, October 14th

Freshman, Sophomores, and Juniors will not attend school on Oct 14th. This is for Seniors only.

The make-up PSAT 10 for all Juniors is Thursday, October 29th

Freshman and Seniors will not attend school on the 29th. This version of PSAT is known as the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT). Sophomores who wish to take the NMSQT can do so if they sign-up with Mrs. Borgmann. Otherwise, only Juniors will test on this date.

Sophomores will not take a make-up PSAT 9!



Spring tests will be announced at a later date!

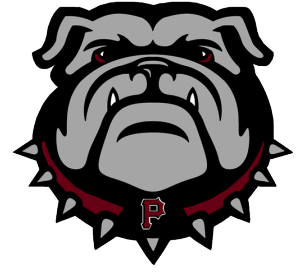
Updated SAT School Day Dates

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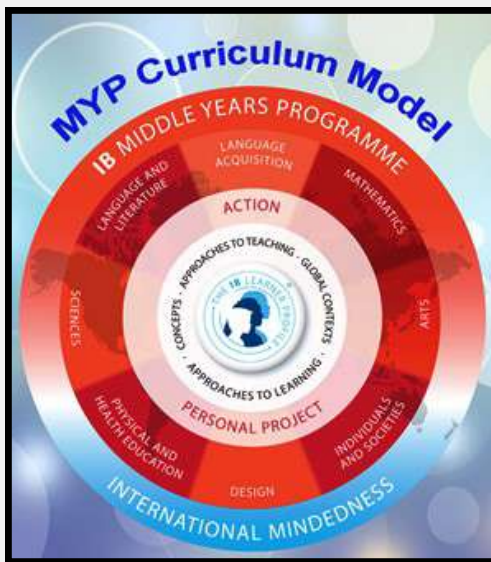

From the Middle Years Programme Coordinator

In early March of 2020, Palisade High School achieved a multi-year goal of becoming an authorized IB Middle Years Programme. We are excited to have achieved this goal because of what it means for your child's educational experience at Palisade High School. All IB Programmes aim to develop the whole learner for success in and beyond the classroom. This begins with the IB core: The Learner Profile and Approaches to Learning Skills.

*Each of the IB Programmes reflects a central desire to provide an education that enables students to make sense of the complexities of the world around them, as well as equipping them with the **skills and dispositions** needed for taking responsible action for the future.*

-What is an IB Education



This philosophy is seen in all IB Programme models with the IB Learner Profile (dispositions) located at the center and surrounded by the Approaches to Learning skills - *along with 3 other core philosophies of an IB education.*

These 10 dispositions are:

1. Inquirers
2. Knowledgeable
3. Thinkers
4. Communicators
5. Principled
6. Open-minded
7. Caring
8. Risk-takers
9. Balanced
10. Reflective

Each has an aspirational definition (see the IB Learner Profile Graphic below).

IB learner profile

The aim of all IB programmes is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world.

As IB learners we strive to be:

INQUIRERS

We nurture our curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. We know how to learn independently and with others. We learn with enthusiasm and sustain our love of learning throughout life.

KNOWLEDGEABLE

We develop and use conceptual understanding, exploring knowledge across a range of disciplines. We engage with issues and ideas that have local and global significance.

THINKERS

We use critical and creative thinking skills to analyse and take responsible action on complex problems. We exercise initiative in making reasoned, ethical decisions.

COMMUNICATORS

We express ourselves confidently and creatively in more than one language and in many ways. We collaborate effectively, listening carefully to the perspectives of other individuals and groups.

PRINCIPLED

We act with integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness and justice and with respect for the dignity and rights of people everywhere. We take responsibility for our actions and their consequences.

OPEN-MINDED

We critically appreciate our own cultures and personal histories, as well as the values and traditions of others. We seek and evaluate a range of points of view, and we are willing to grow from the experience.

CARING

We show empathy, compassion and respect. We have a commitment to service, and we act to make a positive difference in the lives of others and in the world around us.

RISK-TAKERS

We approach uncertainty with forethought and determination; we work independently and cooperatively to explore new ideas and innovative strategies. We are resourceful and resilient in the face of challenges and change.

BALANCED

We understand the importance of balancing different aspects of our lives—intellectual, physical and emotional—to achieve well-being for ourselves and others. We recognize our interdependence with other people and with the world in which we live.

REFLECTIVE

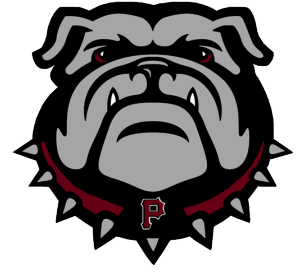
We thoughtfully consider the world and our own ideas and experience. We work to understand our strengths and weaknesses in order to support our learning and personal development.

The IB learner profile represents 10 attributes valued by IB World Schools. We believe these attributes, and others like them, can help individuals and groups become responsible members of local, national and global communities.



Palisade High School

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At Palisade High School we embrace the learner profile as an essential component of our core values of PACK. PACK is a school wide system which supports students as they challenge themselves to grow, while also holding them accountable for their learning progress and personal behavior.

Perseverance: We never give up. *Risk Taker, Reflective*

Attitude: Our attitude dictates our direction. *Caring, Open-Minded*

Character: We act with integrity, honesty and ethically. *Principled, Balanced, Open-minded, Risk-taker*

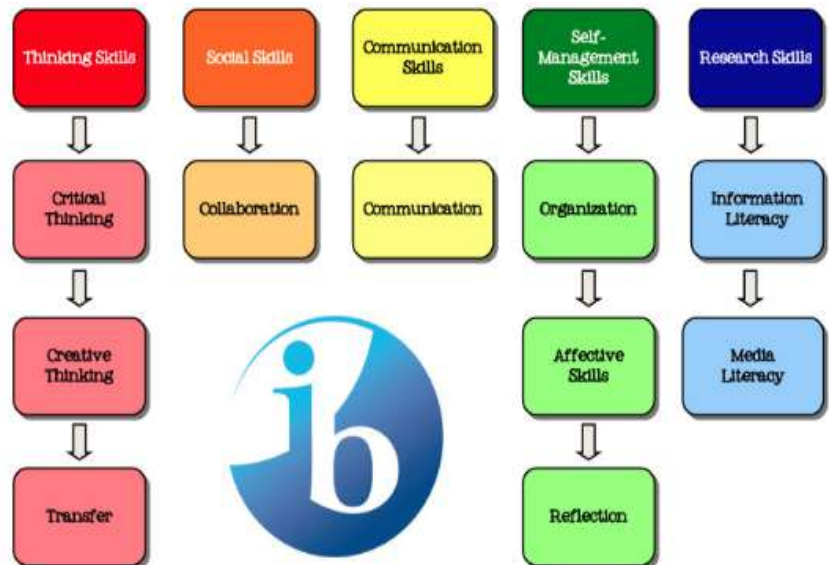
Knowledge: We exercise initiative in applying our learning. *Reflective, communicator, Inquirer, Knowledgeable, Thinker.*

The Approaches to Learning (ATL) Skills speak to the ways students access and demonstrate their learning. These skills are transferable across all content, as well as outside the classroom.

As an IB MYP school, teachers intentionally plan learning opportunities that support the development of the learner profile traits and ATL skills through engagement with their content.

For example in history when exploring what is gained and lost with the advancement of technology, students conduct interviews with people from multiple generations. This requires the development of communication skills, specifically developing questioning techniques for quality interviews, as well the development of the learner profile traits of Inquirers, Communicators, and even Risk-takers.

Learning Skills in the MYP— Approaches to Learning (ATL) Skills



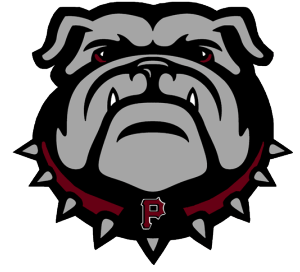
Content level teams collaboratively plan their units and learning experiences, providing each student with opportunities to refine and reflect on the Learner Profile traits and ATL skill development in every content area.

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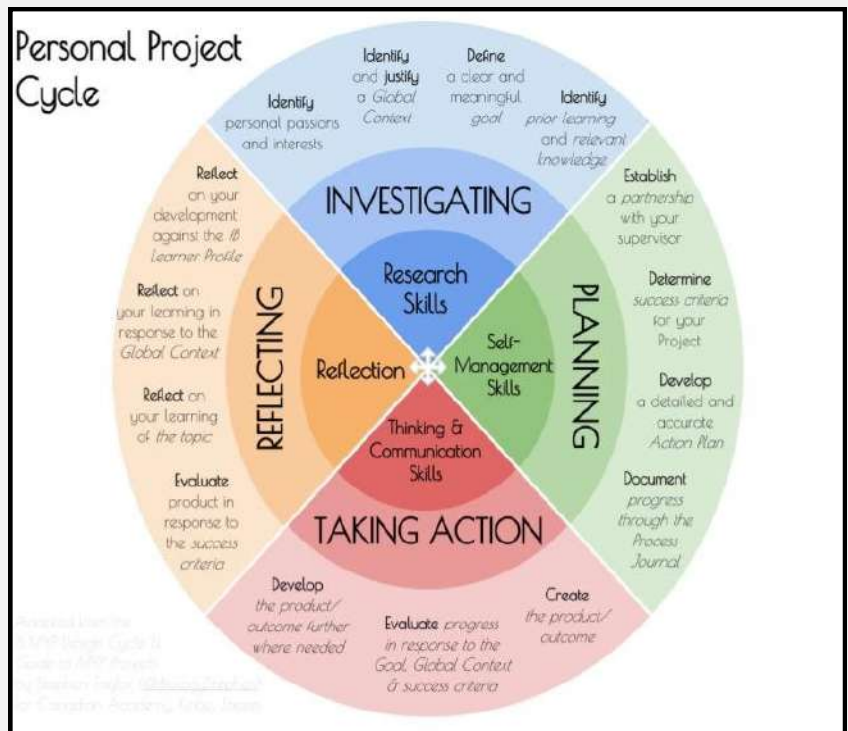
The Sophomore Personal Project

The Sophomore Personal Project is an exciting opportunity for all sophomores to explore, learn, and take action in a personal area of interest. The project is the culmination of student learning in an IB Middle Years Programme where students demonstrate multiple aspects of the IB core- their strengths and development in the Approaches to Learning skills, Service as Action, and personal growth and reflection on the Learner Profile traits.

During academic mentor students are guided through topic selection, goal setting, establishing success criteria, planning an approach, and organizing time and materials. Though students are provided some time during school to work on their projects, much of their work will be done outside of school. As a general guideline students should plan to invest about 25 hours of time into their projects; this time limit is to support students maintaining a healthy **balance- an IB Learner Profile trait.**

Last year students' projects spanned many interests, from tying flies to flying an airplane, from planning and completing a first hunting trip to planning and completing a children's book. This year the student topics are just as diverse and I am excited to see what the students learn and how they grow through this process.

If you have a sophomore I encourage you to talk with them about their project, as well as share your own experiences in projects you've taken on - from home projects to personal and professional goals- we have insight and experiences to share.

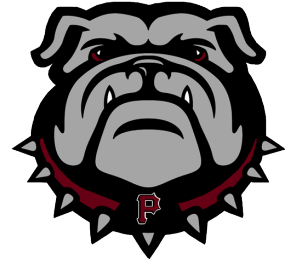
