Representative Tipton Visits GJHS

On Thursday, October 15, students in Mr. Weekley's High School Scholar's Government class (CMU Political Science 101) were able to host Congressman Scott Tipton. The Congressman spent about fifteen minutes going over some of the current issues of the day, the Congressional lawmaking process, and other topics, and then he spent the remainder of the class time taking questions from students. Students asked law-related questions dealing with Katie's Law, the career path of being a small business owner to being in politics, the vetting process for any refugees coming to Colorado from North Africa and Europe, and issues that affect small businesses as well as personal questions about how often does he make it back home and how his job affects his family.



During the follow-up interview with Callihan Marshall from KREX News, Mr. Tipton explained how impressed he was with the students' behavior and the quality of their questions: "When you get in a classroom full of students it's some of the toughest town halls that you can do because you never know what's coming. These are all on point questions and it showed that here in class they're obviously paying attention to current events."

Their main focus of this trip is to help one of the GJHS Nepalese students with her village in Nepal which was leveled in the devastating earthquake that rocked Nepal last spring. Not only do they plan on taking nearly 1,000 pounds of donated supplies, but also offer humanitarian support and city-wide attention to this horrible tragedy.

District 51 School Board Candidate Forum

Academic Letter Ceremony

Each year, we celebrate our students' academic excellence by awarding an academic letter to qualified students. Academic letters and Superintendent's pins will be presented at the Fall Academic Letter award ceremony on November 3, 2015 at 6:30 p.m. in the GJHS Auditorium.

The Academic Letter Award is based on the following criteria: Full time student at GJHS, including District 51 satellite programs and a GPA of 3.5 and above. Full time status means that a student must be enrolled in at least three credits each semester. Superintendent's Scholars are students with a 4.0 GPA and above. This year we are recognizing 390 students.

All Winter Sports Registration

All winter sports athletes must be registered on line through Family ID. If you were in a fall sport, please go into Family ID and change your fall sport to your winter sport. If you have not registered, go into Family ID, complete registration, bring current sports physical and \$140.00 participation fee into the Athletics/Activities Office before Friday, November 6th. Registration will close on that day. The official mandatory start date for all winter sports try outs is Thursday, November 12, 2015. If you are not registered by Wednesday, November 11, 2015, you will not be allowed to start practice on the 12th. Remember that the first tryout date is Thursday, November 12th. Additional tryout dates will not be added for those failing to register on time.






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Class of 2016 and Early Grads

The GJHS counseling team worked with seniors on October 13 and 14 in the library to take advantage of Free App Week and making plans for life after high school. On Tuesday, 156 seniors visited the library to work on college applications, resumes, and job applications. Plus they had the chance to ask questions and get answers about planning for life after high school, whether they are college-bound, work force-bound, or military-bound!

Then on Wednesday, they saw 155 students, all busy planning for life after high school in the library. All together, 224 of our 406 seniors were helped on either Tuesday, Wednesday or both!




Here is what your high school counselors were up to last week:

Each school worked hard to help seniors take their next steps towards life after high school. The majority of seniors worked with counselors to complete college applications, but still many others worked to explore military options, and file as job seekers with the Colorado Workforce Center.

Last year, we had a grand total of 1150 college applications submitted throughout the district.

This year we had a total of 1421 applications submitted across D51! 1041 of these applications were submitted to colleges offering D51 students a free app during this week. With an average application cost of \$50, our students saved roughly \$52,050 in applications fees this year.
