-Absolutely no handheld manual pencil sharpeners allow at Wilson School



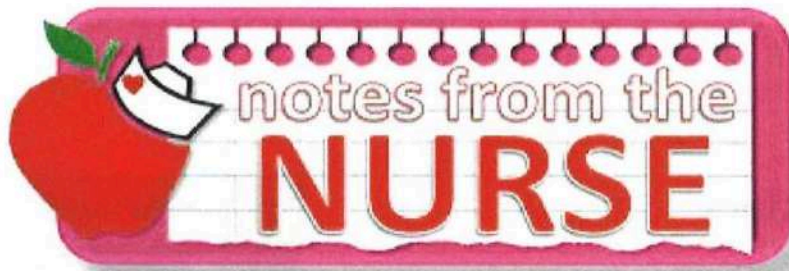
Principal Bus Safety Award:
