1ST GRADE NEWS

Happy Fall Everyone! We are off to a good start to in First Grade! The students should be familiar with the routines and procedures in their classrooms. In first grade, we have a working snack time so be sure to only send in one easy to eat snack. That is all that is necessary.

Now that the weather is finally cooling off, remember that we still go out for recess so be sure your child has a coat, gloves and hat when necessary.

Wednesday is the day that school store is open but only from 8:15-8:30 – If you want your child to go to the school store, then more than a few dollars is needed.

We are working on reading and tapping out CVC words. Currently we are reviewing all the short vowel sounds – a-e-i-o-u. In addition, we are writing simple sentences, starting with a capital letter and ending with a period. In Math, we have broken down numbers to 10 to learn all the partners of these numbers. We are also, adding and subtracting numbers to 10.

Remember to read every night with your child!

This year, we are doing Morning Meeting to share our ideas and experiences...this is a bonding time, for all of us to get to know one another and to become one friendly, helpful unit of 2nd graders. There are 17 Units in our Foundations Class. Each Unit has two parent pages that you should gather together and keep at home. This means you will have all the information you might ever need to help your student with the work and study. Unit 1 involved three different ways to make the hard “K” sound...”c”, “k” and “ck”, with “ck” always coming at the end of a one syllable word. Unit 2 deals with bonus letters and glued sounds.

GRADE 3

We are off to a busy start in third grade! Students are reading stories that focus on character development and character traits. We are using text evidence to prove a character’s trait. Foundations has also begun, and the

students are very excited to be learning cursive this year! Please be sure your child is spending at least twenty minutes reading each day at home.

In math, we are continuing to explore properties of multiplication and division. Students have learned various representations, including equal groups, arrays, repeated addition, and number lines. Please practice math facts daily at home to increase fluency. Our new science program is also underway, where third graders will be exploring engineering.

GRADE 4

Welcome to 4th grade!! There is excitement in the air as we start off this school year. We have a brand new Science program and we are anxiously anticipating the arrival of our new Reading program.

In math we are working on place value and rounding numbers. The students are learning how to write numbers up to the millions place in word form and in expanded form.

We have just completed our beginning of the year mclass testing for reading and plan to start math testing.

GRADE 5

The fifth graders are off to a great start for their final year at Hopeville. This is the year where we can practice being the role models that we know we are!

In Math, we have already looked into computation (addition and subtraction) of fractions featuring unequal denominators. We are using visual representations such as models or pictures to help us within this process. Likewise, we are deepening our understanding of fractions by using equivalent fractions. Students will soon be working with decimal values as we try to connect value patterns and reasoning. I-Ready is almost ready for us! (See what we did there?!)

In ELA, we are currently working on mystery stories reviewing story elements and learning about mystery vocabulary. We have started to write our own mystery stories! We are also researching countries for Hispanic Heritage Month and will be creating folktales.
