
# **Building Strong Readers**Families as Partners



## Reading is an Education and Economic Issue

88% of the students who failed to earn a diploma were struggling readers in third grade

→ Students who are not reading proficiently in third grade:

4X

Are four times more likely to not graduate high

#### **High School Dropouts**

12%

88%

- Are not eligible for 90% of the jobs in the economy
- Have yearly earnings that are less than 50% of someone with a Bachelor's Degree
- Make up nearly 50% of all heads of households on welfare

If African American or Hispanic, are six times more likely to drop out or fail to graduate from high school

If low-income minority, are eight times more likely to drop out or fail to graduate from high school



## Improving Reading Outcomes

The purpose of the LBPA is to improve the reading skills of Kindergarten through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade public school students so that every student completing 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reads at or above grade level (SB 2157)

It is required that ALL Kindergarten students be assessed (Kindergarten Readiness Assessment) at the beginning and end of the school year to determine readiness and growth (SB 2572)

All K-3 students take a *Universal Screener* at the beginning, middle, and end of the year to determine progress in reading

## Universal Screener and Diagnostic Assessment

K-3 students identified through the <u>BOY Universal Screener</u> whose results are below grade level should be addressed with a diagnostic to determine targeted instruction and interventions.



Diagnostic assessments provide in-depth information about an individual student's particular strengths and needs for Tier 2 supplemental instruction and/or Tier 3 intensive intervention



The intensive reading instruction and intervention must be documented for each student in an <u>individual reading plan</u> (IRP)


## Parental Notification

→ If a K-3 student has been identified with a substantial deficit in reading, the teacher will immediately, and with each quarterly progress report, notify parents or legal guardians of the determination and plans for addressing the deficiency, including sharing strategies that parents can use to support reading at home.

#### What are we doing as a district to get your students prepared?

#### **District Instructional Team:**

Meets with administrators to desegregate the school data to determine what standards need to be addressed

#### **Administrative Team:**

 Meets with the teachers to share the school's data and to assist with desegregating the teacher's data to determine which standards will be addressed

#### **Teachers will:**


• Conduct one-on-one student conferences and one-on-one parent/teacher conferences to discuss data and next steps

#### Next Steps can consist of and are not limited to:

- > Re-engagement a fun and innovative way of reteaching the standards
- Power-Time a specific time during the school day for students to be grouped by needs. The teacher focuses on that one skill in a small group
- > Small group is typically a group of 5-6 students working on a specific standard allowing the students to practice, make mistakes and work together to learn how to think about what they are learning
- > Reteach to teach again the standards that students have not mastered. These standards are chosen based on the assessment data
- > Test taking strategies are strategies that help the students to be successful when taking any type of assessment
- ➤ Interventions are additional instructional resources and support that is aligned to a student's needs.
- > After-school tutorial is the opportunity to help students on a one-on-one or small group basis outside of the regular classroom time
- > EL Bootcamp is a bootcamp for English Language Learners focusing on test taking strategies, grammar, comprehension, reading and writing. It will begin on February 28, 2022 and end on March 2, 2022.




