


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

What is Needs Assessment?

- It is a collaboration between learner and instructor where the learner shares his or her:
 - Proficiencies
 - Background
 - Educational Goals
 - Expected Outcomes

Why is Needs Assessment Important?

- Can be used to place learners in classes and programs
- Provides for responsively designed curriculum
- Provides important background information about the learner's educational experience, life experience, and learning preferences

Research indicates that when instructors understand their learners and address the learners goals, learners persist in attending class.
