

# World Language (Academic Leader: Señor Rick Rule)

World language classes are off to a good start!

Students in Spanish I will be learning the basics of the language - the sound system, questioning techniques, the basic structures of the language and the present tense - the major project for the first semester is the scrapbook project in which the students demonstrate a mastery of the material studied during the semester - clothing, colors, descriptions, likes and dislikes etc.

Spanish II - major focus in on working with the past tenses (Preterite and Imperfect) - major projects for the year include - news broadcast project, children's story, and exchange student project.

Spanish III - shifts the focus to commands and expressing hopes, wishes and doubts. Major projects for the year include - the advertising project and the mad scientist project.

Spanish IV - works at a deeper level with all the skills learned in the first three years and delves into the future and conditional tenses. Major projects include - shield presentations, environmental public service announcement on an issue in one of the Spanish speaking countries.
