First day of school: Monday, August 31

I hope that you and your children have had an enjoyable fun-filled summer. With a strong commitment to work for the success of your children, our administrative team, the entire staff of *Beecher Road School*, and I look forward to the new school year.

There are many things that we expect to see happening in the 2009 – 2010 school year at Beecher Road School. We look forward to enhancing the quality and depth of our reading and writing programs. In addition, there will be a curriculum review in mathematics, grades K-6, as part of the Board of Education approved curriculum cycle. The use of technology will expand as a tool for accelerating student learning. The Arts will continue to make learning come alive at Beecher Road School. A revised social studies curriculum will be implemented in grades K-4. Plans are being developed for the coming year in the area of wellness in nutrition, physical activity, outdoor classroom, and policy review. In addition, we will continue to look for new ways to support the emotional and social development of children. Likewise, it is anticipated that, through a Town appointed committee, proposals for a major school facilities upgrade will be brought to referendum. We also expect to have solar panels installed on the roof of the Kindergarten wing as a first step in energy efficiency and efforts to *go green*.

We are in an exciting time at Beecher Road School – a time filled with promise and anticipation of new challenges and opportunities. Working together, we will continue to do wonderful things for our children.

The following facility projects were completed or will be completed in the near future:

- Detailed room cleaning, floor waxing and painting have kept our custodial staff busy this summer. The school facility looks better than ever.
- The north parking lot has been lined and painted.
- One of the two trailers in the south parking lot has been removed. The second will be relocated in the near future.
- The intrusion alarm system is being upgraded to combine two systems into one for enhanced capabilities of programming and monitoring.
- Grounds maintenance work is being done now.
- The BRS Town Building Committee has been meeting diligently over the summer months, preparing the way for an anticipated Town referendum in 2010 on plans for a major infrastructure update of BRS.

We have received the scores from last spring's CMT's, and there are many indicators of success. These results will be shared at the September 21 Board of Education meeting as well as in a future newsletter. Student CMT reports will be sent home to parents when they are received from the state.

A busy summer at Beecher

Summer programs for children: Did you know that hundreds of children participate in summer programs held at *Beecher Road School* every day? It is amazing to see the breadth of opportunities offered to enrich minds and build bodies. The Woodbridge Recreation Department uses the BRS facility for many summer programs. School programs such as the *Summer Enrichment Program* and *Extended Day Program* attract hundreds. The school is a year-round hub of exciting activity.

Summer Curriculum Work: Administrators and staff members worked on several key curriculum areas this summer including Social Studies, Health Education, World Language (Spanish), Language Arts, Science and a SRBI (*Scientifically Research Based Intervention*) school-wide model.

Reader's/Writer's Institute(s): A four-day *Reader's Workshop* Institute was conducted at BRS from June 23 to June 26. The well-attended institute was broken into two sections – primary and intermediate. During the months of July and August, members of the BRS staff attended weeklong *Reader's* or *Writer's Workshop* Institutes at Columbia University. September 3: Grades 5 and 6


September 9: Grades 3, 4, and Multi-Age Group
