

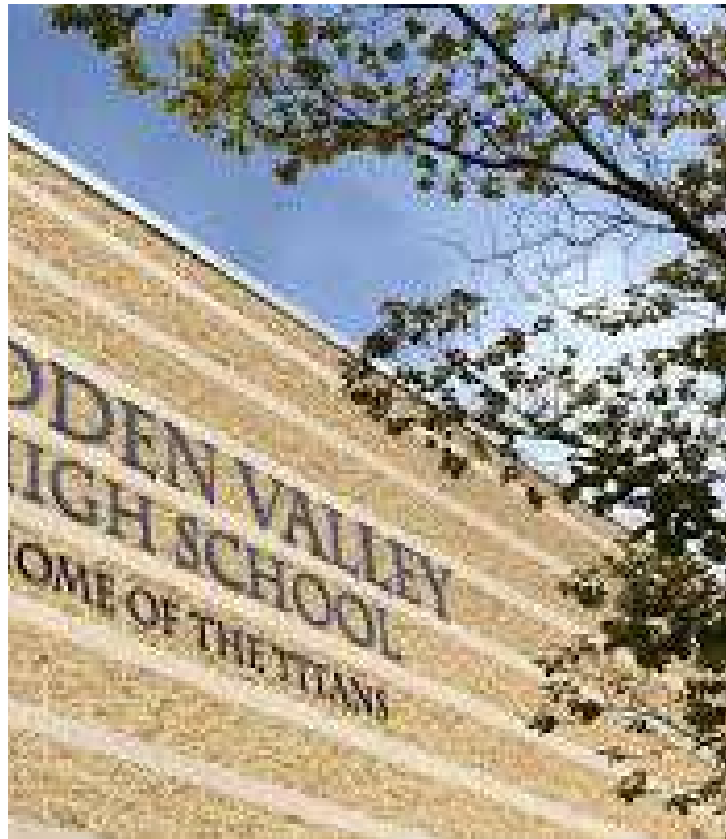

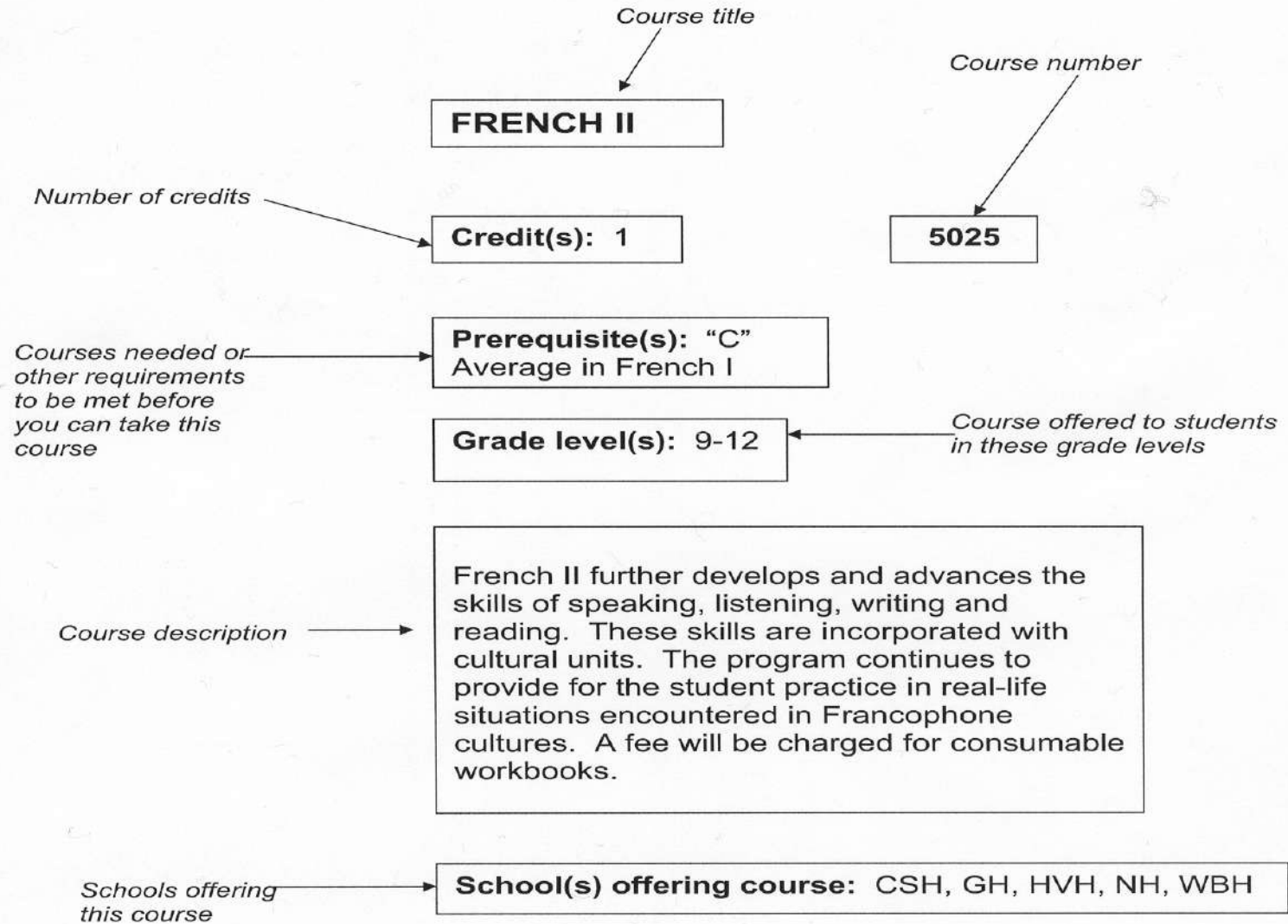

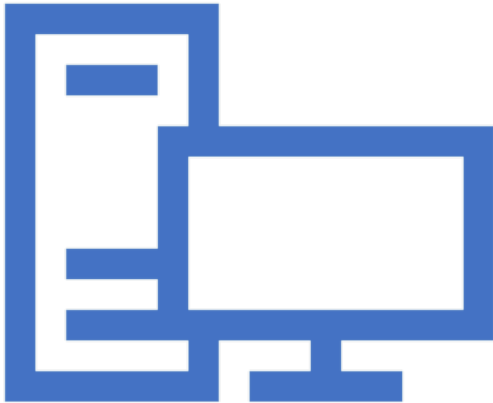

1. Failure of a course that is a prerequisite for a scheduled course or a graduation requirement
