Freshman Admission Requirements

a-g subjects	FULL	ELC
a. History/Social Sciences	2 years	1 year
b. English	4 years	2 years
c. Mathematics	3 years	2 year
d. Laboratory Science	2 years	1 year
e. Language other than English	2 years	1 year
f. Visual & Performing Arts	1 year	
g. College-Preparatory Elective (or another a-f course)	1 year	4 years

GPA

At least a 3.00

Admissions Tests

SAT or ACT Plus Writing

GPA REQUIREMENT

- ⑩ Minimum GPA of **3.0** (weighted) in a-g courses
- ⑩ Computed using 10th and 11th grade academic courses
- ⑩ No more than 8 semesters of H/AP weighted credit

Admission Test Requirements

⑩ ACT (*plus Writing*) OR SAT

⑩ SAT Subject Tests

⑩ NOT REQUIRED

⑩ May be “recommended” by specific programs within the university

⑩ Tests must be taken no later than this December, preferably earlier, to ensure that applications receive prompt and full consideration

⑩ Universities will WAIT to review your application until all test scores are received

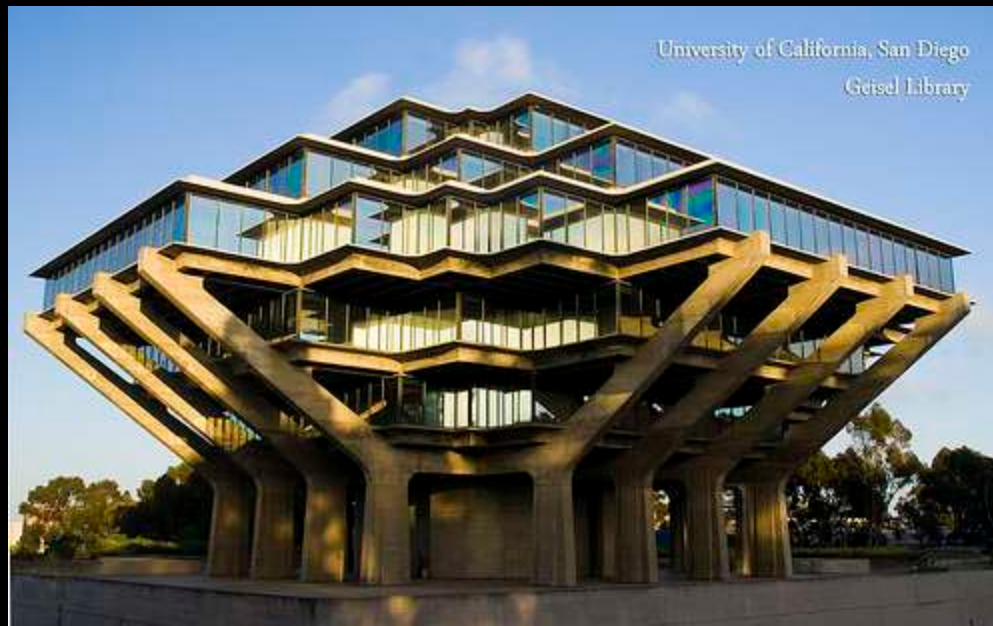

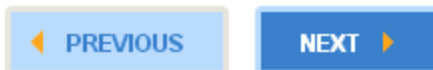

I haven't taken the ACT or SAT Reasoning Test. What should I do?

I plan to study for and take my ACT or SAT after I graduate from high school. Is this acceptable?

All requirements for freshman admission, including the examination requirement, must be completed prior to high school graduation.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

- ⑩ Applicants are asked to respond to two prompts:
 - Describe the world you come from — i.e., family, community or school - and tell us how your world has shaped your dreams and aspirations.
 - Tell us about a personal quality, talent, accomplishment, contribution or experience that is important to you. What about this quality or accomplishment makes you proud and how does it relate to the person you are?
- ⑩ Word Count: 1,000 words total
- ⑩ UC Recommends one prompt be about 250 words

PERSONAL STATEMENT

- ⑩ An opportunity for applicants to provide information that talks about who you are and what makes you unique
- ⑩ Present ideas and topics that are not already included in your application
- ⑩ Think of it as a “personal interview”
- ⑩ Be open, honest, and be yourself

PERSONAL STATEMENT

- Do not be campus specific!
- Don't stretch the truth, just be honest
- Be cautious of your timeline. Ask yourself, is this relevant to me now?
- Tie it back to you. Always.
- Use "I" or "my" statements
- Use specific examples
- It's not an essay, structure is not graded

UC Personal Statement

General advice on writing a personal statement.

Avoid

Acronyms

- Quotes/Dialogue
- Creative Writing
- Story telling/scene setting
- Repetition
- Asking question
- Inappropriate use of humor



PERSONAL STATEMENT

- ⑩ Present your ideas and information in a focused, thoughtful manner, using specific, concrete examples to support the points you want to make
- ⑩ Relax! This is one of many pieces of information a UC considers in reviewing your application. An admission decision will not be based on your personal statement alone
- ⑩ You have 30 minutes to type your personal statement!

Additional Comments Section

- ⑩ Use Additional Comments box for clarification, expansion of important details:
 - ⑩ Other relevant non a-g courses
 - ⑩ Explain a poor grade
 - ⑩ Specific obstacles
- ⑩ Describe anything else that you have not had the opportunity to include elsewhere in your application.
 - ⑩ **550-word limit**

Key Messages from the UC

- ⑩ Go to the Financial aid website for each college you apply to – there may be an additional app.
- ⑩ Create a professional e-mail address
- ⑩ **PORTALS** – Check and read EVERYTHING
- ⑩ Do not drop a class once you have applied to a UC
- ⑩ Apply broadly – UC Merced
- ⑩ **APPLY EARLY!**
- ⑩ Do not miss any deadlines!

UC MERCED

- **EVERYONE** who is UC eligible should apply to Merced
- Guarantees admission to ANY UC eligible student
- Small, private school feel!

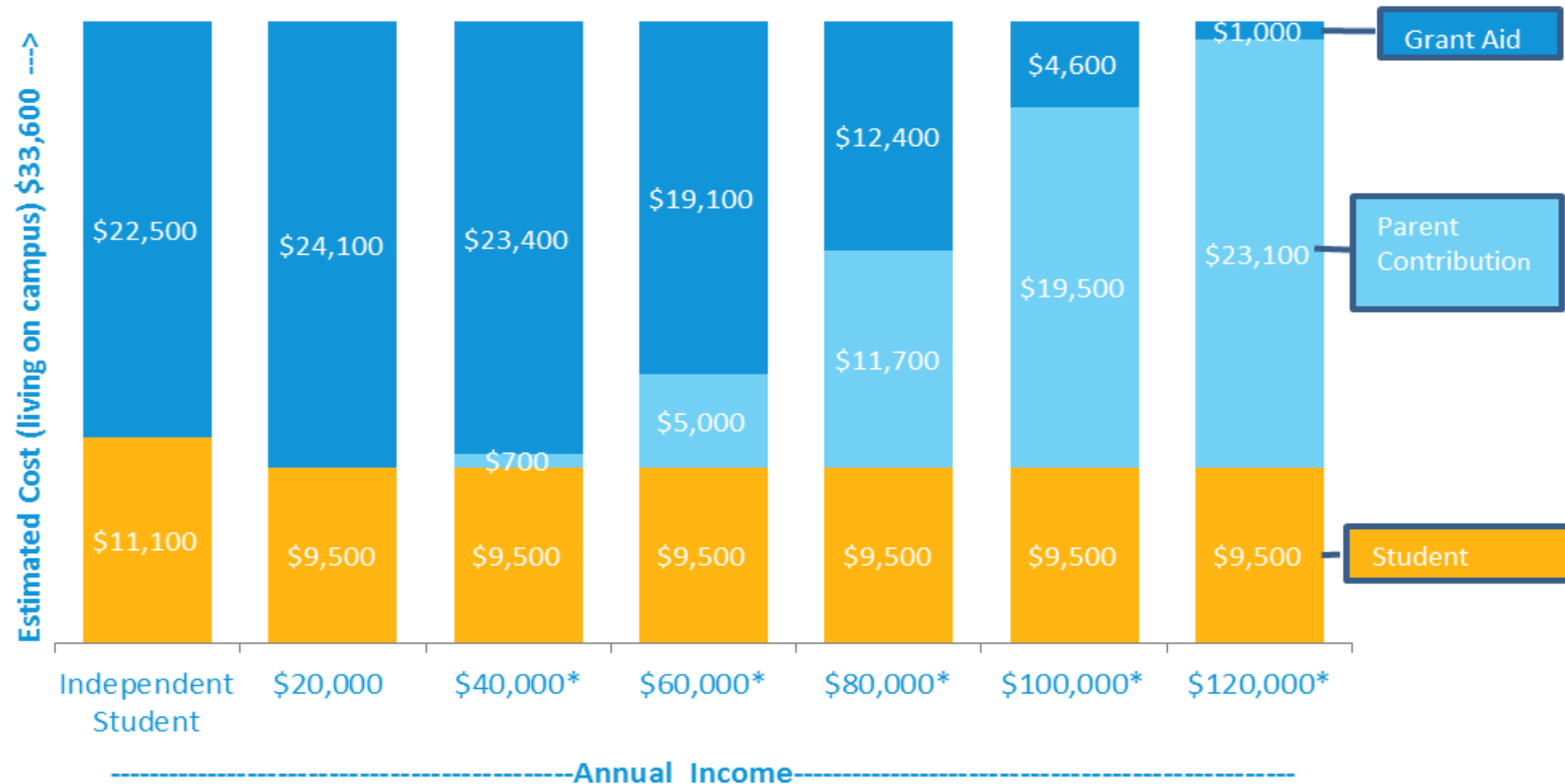
Estimated Annual Costs 2015-2016

- ⑩ California resident with total family income under \$80,000 per year
- ⑩ 4 years of undergraduate study only
- ⑩ Apply on time for financial aid
- ⑩ Demonstrate financial need
- ⑩ No special application

Expect to work and borrow

- Every undergraduate seeking financial aid at UC will be expected to work (less than half-time) and to borrow a “manageable amount” of student loans
- It is no longer practical to “work one’s way through college”
