

Ginger Latimer, Drama Teacher, Madera South High School Students in Mrs. Latimer's Drama I Class study Shakespeare's Sonnets

William Shakespeare's Sonnets are poems which cover themes such as the passage of time, love, beauty and mortality.

William Shakespeare wrote a collection of 154 Sonnets.

As students study Shakespeare's Sonnets they learn about:

Imagery - the use <u>figurative language</u> to represent objects, actions, and ideas in such a way that it appeals to our physical senses.

"It seems she hangs upon the cheek of night."

Ambiguity - is a type of meaning in which several interpretations are plausible. A common aspect of ambiguity is uncertainty.

"Therefore, I lie with her and she with me, That is why I lie to her and she to me."

Paradox - a statement or proposition that seems self-contradictory or absurd but in reality, expresses a possible truth.

"How can you see most clearly when your eyes are, in fact, closed?"
