Course Description

Students will learn the basic principles of art, the fundamentals of design, color and drawing. Learning in this class will give students an opportunity to strengthen and develop skills and knowledge through a variety of learning situations.

By the completion of the school year, students are expected to do the following:

- 1. Demonstrate the ability to perform well in the execution of a variety in drawing styles.
- 2. Demonstrate a basic understanding of color theory.
- 3. Understand and apply the basic fundamental of design.
- 4. Be able to understand and apply the power of art as communication.
- 5. Begin relating creative products to appropriate cultural, historical and stylistic context.
