A Message from Principal Dan Bollinger

Hello Palisade Families~

Spring has sprung, and it's a beautiful time of year in Palisade. As you drive to our campus, you're likely to pass peach trees in bloom. We and our students are lucky to live, work, and study in such an idyllic setting. While much of 2020-2021 has not been ideal, there's little that makes this Spring different from any we've known in the past, and there is much to celebrate in the near future, including the graduation of the Class of 2021. This month's newsletter, like next months', is dedicated largely to outline upcoming events that all parents/guardians will want to note.

April 7: Telephone Parent Teacher Conferences from 3:30-7:30pm. (Virtual, or by phone)

Àpril 8–23: Students begin building their schedules for next year, with support from our Counselors. *D51 Online students registered at PHS, see note on page 2.

April 13: SAT and PSAT 9 testing, required for Freshman and Juniors. No school for Sophomores or Seniors.

April 14: PSAT 10 testing, required for Sophomores. No school for other grade levels.

April 13: Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting at 6:00pm in the PHS library, focused on goal setting for next year. Any parent/guardian is welcome to attend.

Other events this month include various Colorado West Music Festival performances, which give our students a chance to both showcase their talents and receive critiques; the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme CAS Expo (highlighting students' projects in the areas of Creativity, Activity, and Service) and banquet (an event celebrating our graduating DP Seniors); and NWEA testing in the areas of reading and math for all Freshman and Sophomores (completed in a class period, giving teachers important data about how best to support their students).

More information about P/SAT testing times and dates can be found on the subsequent pages of this newsletter. However, I want to communicate how important it is that our students attend and give their best. These State tests are important because all students need to show testing proficiency for graduation and because PHS teachers and staff need to know how students are performing so they can better meet students' needs and help prepare students for their futures.

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Even while PSAT is thought to be "only a practice test," it is high-stakes for the school and a valuable opportunity to practice for the SAT, which is high-stakes for students. Research shows students do much better on the SAT when they've had multiple opportunities to practice. Lastly, testing is important because the results reflect what's working at PHS and where we might make improvements. When students participate in testing and do their best, we have better data and therefore make more informed decisions.

Because testing is so important for students and the school, we closely monitor attendance and will pull-in students for make-up testing in the event a student misses the first exam. Please do not schedule appointments on April 13th and 14th.

Additionally, students who do not attempt to demonstrate proficiency on our standardized tests- a graduation requirement- will not be eligible for their next tiered badge until they attempt to demonstrate proficiency. That means, for example, if you're a sophomore and you don't test, you won't get off-campus privileges until you do, and that opportunity won't come around again for one year.

Lastly, Dr. Sirko has recently written to families about two important but non-related topics: masks and staff reductions. For the remainder of the school year, students and staffs will continue to be vigilant and wear masks so as to keep students in school and out of quarantine. While many (if not most) D51 schools are losing positions for the 2021-2022 school year, Palisade High School is not. In fact, we'll be adding a couple of positions in our core subjects. We're able to add positions because our enrollment remains high and PHS continues to be a school parents want their children to attend. We appreciate your commitment to your students, our staff, and our school community. We are honored to be stewards of your child's learning and future success, and we are committed to continuous improvement. Again, if you'd like to contribute to conversations about our current and future initiatives, please consider attending one of our CAC meetings (the next is April 13).

*D51 Online students who are registered with PHS and plan to return to PHS next year, please check your schoolemail regularly. In the next two weeks, you'll receive a link to a google form, sent by our counseling department. Use the google form to indicate your preferred classes for next year, and your counselor will build you a schedule.

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Counselor's Corner

COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTS – 2020-2021

State Mandated SAT date for ALL Juniors is April 13, 2021 at PHS- no registration necessary! Each PHS Junior will be taking the SAT on this date at the school. Most colleges require the ACT or SAT for admissions (check your college's website for admission requirements). Some colleges and universities require the writing or essay portion of these tests as well.

ALL STUDENTS

Log on to your Naviance account to make sure that your current email and phone number listings are correct. If your email is up-to-date, you will receive several notifications throughout the year about scholarships and college information.

To get started, go to the PHS home page at <u>http://phs.mesa.k12.co.us/</u>. Click on the counseling tab then go to "Naviance Student" at the bottom. Students: Use your StudentVue username and password to log on. Parents who want to be added to their student's account can have one set up by emailing MaryJane.Seriani@d51schools.org.

CAREER CENTER REGISTRATION FOR 2021/2022

The Career Center provides students with opportunities to learn valuable career skills while earning high school core and elective credit. Some programs also have college credits attached. Students spend half of the day at the Career Center, and their time at PHS in their core classes. Transportation provided. Students interested in attending the Career Center next year should complete an Enrollment Request through the Career Center's website here. Students applying by March 31st will be given priority consideration.

SCHEDULING FOR 2021/2022

Students will receive scheduling paperwork throughout the month of April. We will notify families of each grade level as we roll out the paperwork.

SENIOR FAMILIES

If your student is planning to attend college next year, you will need to help him or her fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA.gov). It is important to complete the FAFSA as soon as you can, since many colleges are planning to start processing financial aid packages in December. Make sure you go to the correct website, www.FAFSA.gov and NOT www.FAFSA.com . Filling out the FAFSA is free! Also, make sure you select that correct college semester: Fall 2021. You will need your 2019 tax forms in order to complete the FAFSA.

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ATTENTION ACCEPTED SENIORS

Colleges communicate important information with you through your student online portal (ie: MavZone @ CMU or MyCUBoulder @ UC Boulder). Do not miss scholarships, housing information, class registration or important dates and activities. Check your portal at least once a week!

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Naviance is kept current and is an excellent source for scholarship information. Make sure you check your email for scholarship alerts.

Students should check Naviance frequently. Go to the college tab, scroll to the bottom of the page for scholarship list and search.

Check with the college you plan on attending for scholarships they offer.

SENIORS


- All Seniors MUST complete their senior exit survey. You will receive a link to access the survey when you pick up your check out form.
- Senior check-out sheets will be available May 10th. The exit survey and check out must be completed prior to graduation practice.
- If you haven't done your FAFSA please come to the counseling office for more information.
- If you've received any scholarships or awards, please come to the counseling office with your information, even if you choose not to accept it.
- If you have been accepted in the armed forces, drop your accepted letter off in the counseling office.

Your last day of school is May 13th. Mandatory graduation practice is May 14th at 9:00 am in the gym. Caps and gowns are distributed following graduation practice.

From the Health Office

Here is important information should your child need to take medication during the school day:

- *A medication request form must be completed by the student's parent/guardian and by a health care provider with prescriptive authority before a medication can be administered at school.
- *Medication request forms are available in the health office or on the school district website under Nursing Services.
- *All medication (prescription and nonprescription) must be in its original container. Ask the pharmacy for a second container for school if needed.
- *All medication should be transported to the school by an adult and handed to a school staff member.

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Parent Introduction to Schoology

This year Palisade High School is launching the use of Schoology as our learning management system. While Schoology is much more than a grade reporting system for teachers, students, and parents, it is likely to be the primary use for parents.

Login: (your account has been created for you, so you will <u>not</u> need to create one or use a code) Your first step as a parent is to make sure you have access to your Schoology account. To do this follow these steps:

- 1. In the Chrome or Safari browser, access Schoology by going to <u>https://app.schoology.com</u>
- 2. Click "forgot password"
- 3. In this screen, put in the email on file with the school district This is the email where you receive district information

4. You will received an auto-generated email from Schoology (check spam or promotional folders if you don't see it in your inbox)

5. Use the link in the email to set your password.

6. Use this email and password to access schoology at <u>https://app.schoology.com</u>



In Student Account:

When you initially login, Schoology takes you to your student's account. If you have more than one student enrolled in D51 and Schoology, click on the arrow next to your students name in the top right corner and make the appropriate selection.


Schoology is our Learning Management System (LMS). Currently all staff at Palisade High School are using Schoology to report progress and grades.

to Schoology as well as the Schoology account itself.


