PLACEMENT REVIEW PROCESS

If a level disparity between teacher recommendation and family choice occurs:

- Speak with the teacher
- If you wish to proceed with the level change, request a placement review form
- Submit completed placement review form to the guidance office no later than April 17th
- Placement will be reviewed at end of term 1
- If decision is to move, it will only be if space and schedule allows and term 1 grade will remain on transcript

Course Waiver Process

- Applications due by April 17th
- Waiver of the graduation requirements
- Typically seniors only
- Medical or extenuating circumstance
- Committee decides in spring
- Sign up for course as if you did not get waiver
