

The Benefits of Applying for the California Scholarship Federation

Why?

CSF acknowledges your academic achievement, looks great on college applications, and may open the door for scholarship opportunities.

Extra Perks?

If you get Sealbearer Status (membership for 4 of your last 6 semesters – 3 semesters for students graduating as juniors), you receive a special seal on your diploma, an indication of Sealbearer Status on your transcript, and a gold cord and at graduation.

Does it take much time or effort?

Nope. You're already doing the work by getting good grades.

Do you qualify?

First, you must be at least a second semester freshman. Second, using the preceding fall/spring semester's report card, the computations below, and the following lists, figure out if you have 10 CSF points. If so, you qualify! Complete an application and turn it in at the front desk. If not, no worries – there's always next semester. **This is a semester-to-semester membership, so members must reapply each semester.**

What now?

If you think you qualify, print out the following application and return your completed application in by the posted date. As per the application instructions, attach a copy of your report card to your application. Please contact us if you have any questions,

Computations:

These computations are based on your report card from the previous fall or spring semester; **please attach a copy of your report card to your application.**

A. To qualify for CSF membership this semester, follow these guidelines:

1. You must earn *a minimum of 10 points* from last semester's grades.
 - a. The first *4 points* must be from LIST I (unless you are a senior applying for membership in February or June).
 - b. The first *7 points* (including the four points described in a) must be from LISTS I and II.
 - c. The remaining points may come from any LIST (I, II or III).
2. You must use *no more than 5 courses* to qualify.
3. *NO CSF* points are given for physical education, courses taken in lieu of physical education, subjects repeated to improve a grade, courses involving clerking and office/teaching assisting, and courses taken on a pass/fail basis.
4. CSF points are granted as follows:

Points for 10 credit classes:	Points for 5 credit classes:	Points for 2.5 credit classes:
A=6	A=3	A=1.5
B=2	B=1	B=0.5
C=0	C=0	C=0
Notes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A grade of D or F in any course, even in one you cannot use to qualify, disqualifies you from membership at this time. • College courses count. • Summer courses do not count.
