Academic Honors Diploma - Requires 47 Credits

Complete ALL Core 40 requirements PLUS EARN:

- **❖ 2 additional math credits**
- **❖** 6 foreign language credits
- **❖** 2 fine arts credits
- Earn a "C" or higher in all classes counting for the diploma
- **❖** Have a grade point average of a B (3.0) or better

And complete one of the following:

6 college credits from priority course list (2 dual credit classes at WNHS) SAT score 1250 or higher (Minimum Reading 590; Minimum Math 560) ACT of 26 or higher

Technical Honors Diploma - Requires 47 Credits

Complete ALL Core 40 requirements AND:

- Earn a "C" or higher in all classes counting for the diploma
- **❖** Have a grade point average of a B (3.0) or better
- **❖** Earn 6 credits in a vocational program
- Earn certification or dual credits from vocational program
