High School Graduation Requirements

BP 6146.1

Instruction

The Governing Board desires to prepare all students to obtain a high school diploma to enable them to take advantage of opportunities for postsecondary education and employment.

Course Requirements

To obtain a high school diploma, students shall complete at least the following courses in grades 9-12, with each course being one year unless otherwise specified:

Math	20	Two courses of Math inclusive of 10 credits of Algebra 1
Science	20	10 Units must be laboratory-based life science and 10 units must be laboratory-based physical science
Social Science	40	Geography, World, U.S., Government/Economics
Fine Art	10	Must be 10 units in the same class
World Language	10	Must be 10 units in the same class
Physical Education	20	
Career Technical Ed	10	
Electives	70	

TOTAL CREDITS: 240

Education Code 51224.5 provides that, as part of the mathematics requirement, students must complete coursework at least equivalent to state content standards for Algebra I. Completion of algebra in grades 7-12 in less than two courses will apply toward satisfying the mathematics requirements; however, all students are required to take at least two years of mathematics in high school, completing 20 credits inclusive of 10 credits of Algebra 1.

Because the prescribed course of study may not accommodate the needs of some students, the Board shall provide alternative means for the completion of prescribed courses in accordance with law.

Exemptions and Waivers

A foster youth, homeless student, or former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, migrant student, or newly arrived immigrant student participating in a newcomer program who transfers into the district any time after completing his/her second year of high school shall be required to complete all graduation requirements specified in Ed Code 51225.3 but shall be exempt from any additional district-adopted graduation requirements, unless determined by the Superintendent or designee that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements to graduate by the end of the fourth year of high school. Within 30 days of transfer, any student shall be notified of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for it. (Education Code 51225.1)

Certificates of Completion

Certificates of Completion will only be provided for students with severe handicaps who have met all applicable graduation requirements, whose IEP goals have been met and shows IEP's have had the Certificate of Completion listed as the educational outcome.

Retroactive Diplomas

Any student who completed grade 12 in the 2003-04 through the 2014-2015 school year and met all applicable graduation requirements other than the passage of the high school exit examination shall be granted a high school diploma. (Education Code 51413)

In addition, the district may retroactively grant high school diplomas to: (Education Code 51430, 51440)

1. Former students who were interned by order of the federal government during World War II or who are honorably discharged veterans of World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, provided that they were enrolled in a district school immediately preceding the internment or military service and did not receive a diploma because their education was interrupted due to the internment or military service in those wars

Deceased former students who satisfy these conditions may be granted a retroactive diploma to be received by their next of kin

2. Veterans who entered the military service of the United States while in grade 12 and who had satisfactorily completed the first half of the work required for grade 12 in a district school

Honorary Diplomas

The Board may grant honorary high school diplomas to: (Education Code 51225.5)

1. An international exchange student who has not completed the course of study ordinarily required for graduation, and who is returning to the home country following the completion of one academic year in the district.

2. A student who is terminally ill

The honorary diploma shall be clearly distinguishable for the regular diploma of graduation awarded by the district. (Education Code 51225.5)
