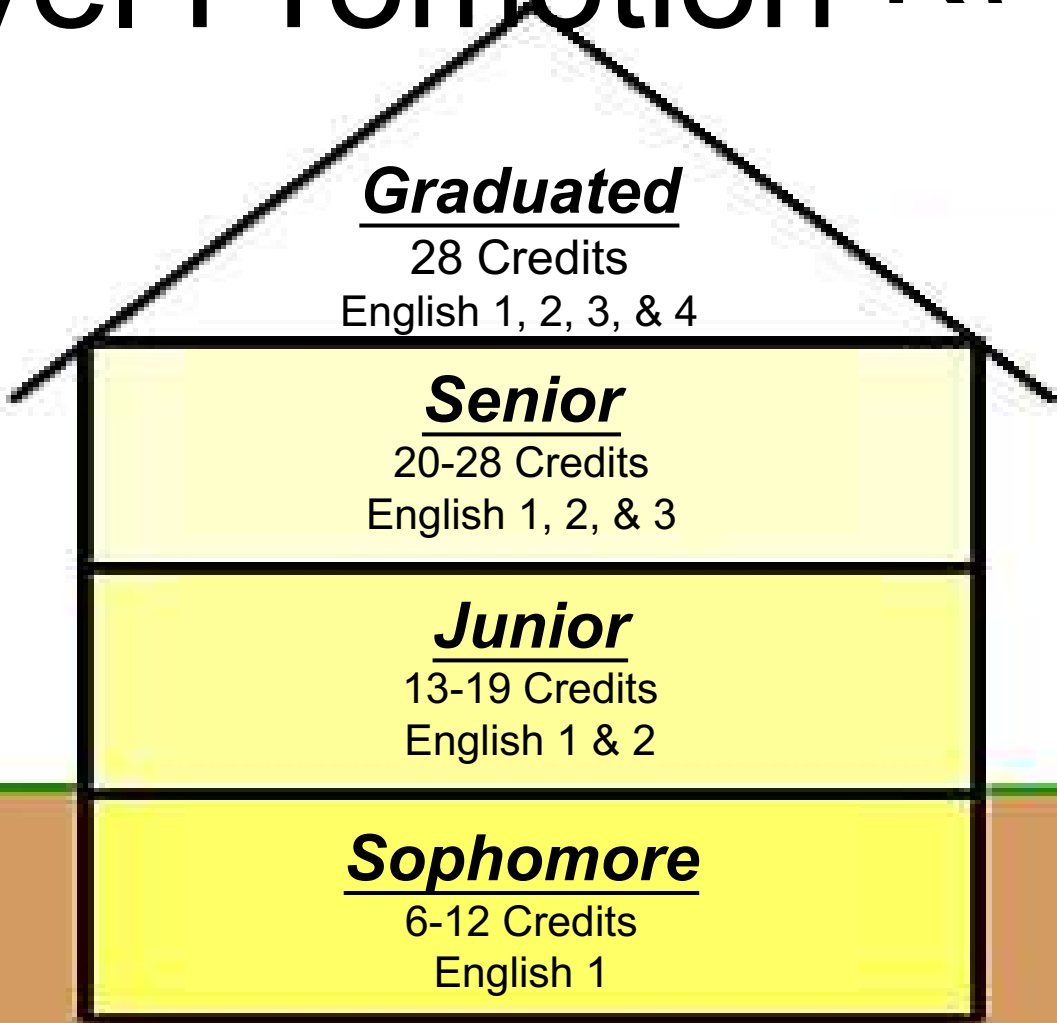

You must take and pass 4 levels of English:

- English I
- English II
- English III
- English IV

**YOU HAVE TO PASS ENGLISH EACH YEAR IN ORDER TO BE PROMOTED**



# Graduation Requirements



You must take and pass 4 levels of Math:

- Foundations of Math (depending on middle school recommendation)
- Math I
- Math II
- Math III
- 4<sup>th</sup> level Math that aligns with your post-secondary plans
  - Math IV
  - Honors Pre-Calculus
  - CCRG Math
    - *This math does not meet UNC system requirements for applying to 4-year universities.*
    - *Students with GPA's within 2.3 to 2.7 are required by the State of North Carolina to take CCRG math regardless of plans after high school. If you meet all other qualifications to apply to a university you will have to take Math IV in addition to CCRG math.*



# Graduation Requirements

SCIENCE

You must take and pass 3 levels of Science:

- Earth/Environmental Science
- Physical Science
- Biology



- Not Needed for Graduation
- Is needed to be a NC Scholar
- Needed for Medical Career



# Graduation Requirements

## SOCIAL STUDIES



You must take and pass 4 levels of Social Studies:

- World History
- American History I & II (*depending on your start date*)
- Economic and Personal Finance
- Civics

# Graduation Requirements

## ELECTIVES

May be Chosen from the following areas:

  - Agriculture Education: Animal Science, Ag. Mechanics, Horticulture, AgriScience
  - Business/Marketing Education: Principles of Business, Entrepreneurship, Sports Marketing, Business Management, Carpentry
  - Family & Consumer Science Education: Child Development, Foods
2. **The Arts**
  - Dance
  - Visual Art
  - Band
3. **JROTC**
4. **Foreign Language**: Spanish
5. **Other**: Yearbook, Peer Group Mentoring, Broadcast & Technology

**REMEMBER**



- ✓ **You must complete a Pathway**
  - 2 or 3 courses in the same area with one being a 2<sup>nd</sup> level course. Exception: JROTC (need 4)
- ✓ **Foreign Language**
  - Not required for graduation
  - Needed for a 4-year University
  - Not recommended to take if GPA is below 2.3

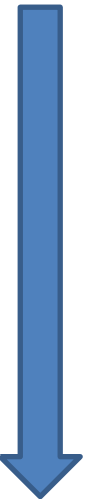

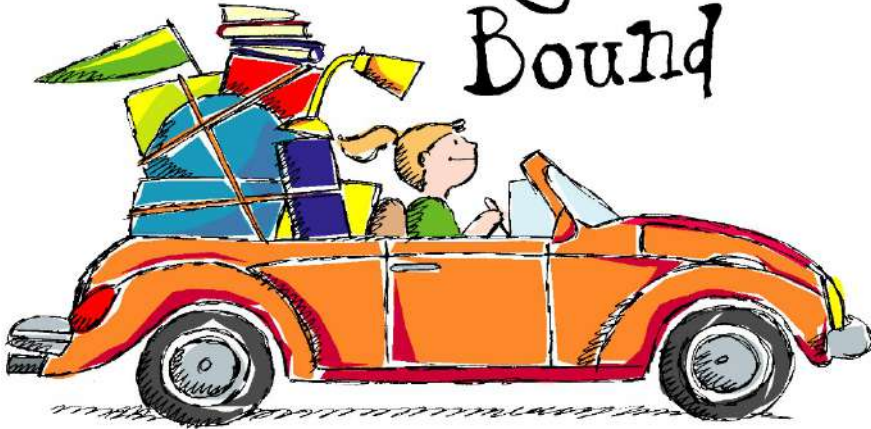

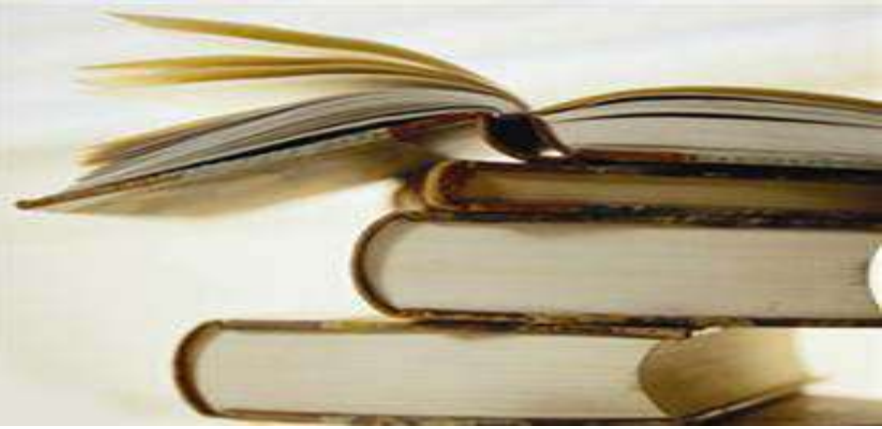

## CTE Honor

- 3.00 Weighted Cumulative GPA by end of junior year
- Earn a minimum grade of 90 in ANY CTE Course by the end of the junior year
- Cannot have failed any course (including SCC)
- Good conduct/No OSS
- Community Service/ Service Project as approved by CDC
- Attend Induction Ceremony
- Complete 4 CTE Classes, which must include a CTE Pathway and earn senior status
- Be a senior student
- Wear White cord at Graduation



# *Every School Day Counts*

## *Attendance Policy High School*

- ✓ Student is allowed to miss 9 full days
- ✓ Can be excused or un-excused
- ✓ Students are required to be present in a class for 60 minutes to be counted present for that class period

## *If your child is out: What do you need to do*

- Provide documentation as to why student was out
- You will have **3** days to turn that documentation in
- After students miss the maximum allowed days what happens:
  - You will be invited to an attendance hearing at the end of the semester

# policy

## TARDIES ARE ISSUED WHEN:

- A student is not in their assigned seat or assigned area when the tardy bell rings
- A student is late to school



**After-School Detention runs from 3:10-4:00 in the Computer Lab. ASD violations will result in a day of ISS & another day of ASD.**

*What Happens When I get too many tardies?*



- 4 Tardies – 1 day After School Detention (ASD)
- 7 Tardies – 2 days ASD
- 10 Tardies – 3 days In School Suspension (ISS)
- 13 Tardies – 5 days ISS

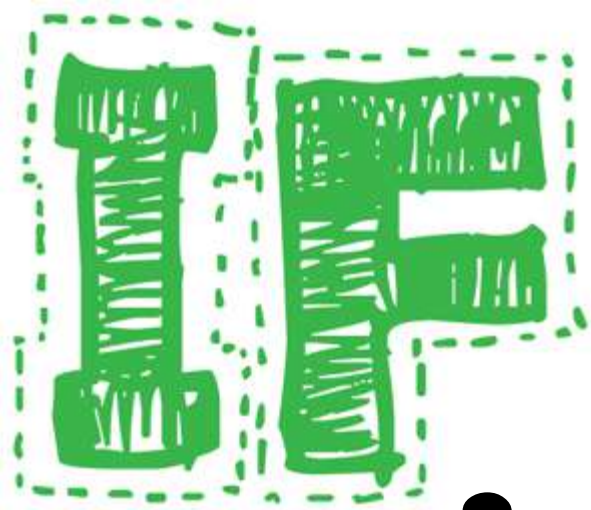

## **CTE Honor**

- Earn Senior Status
- 3.00 Weighted GPA
- Make at least a 90 in one CTE course
- Not Failed any Course
- Complete four CTE Classes, which must include a CTE Pathway
- No OSS
- Community Service Project
- Attend Induction Ceremony
- Wear Blue/White cord at Graduation





## Career & College Promise (CCP)/Sampson Community College (SCC)



- Sampson Community College (SCC) and Sampson County Schools (SCS) have established a Career and College Promise Program (CCP), which allows qualified students to take college courses while in high school.
- Under this agreement, Sampson County students who meet the requirements will have the opportunity to register for courses offered on the campus of Sampson Community College.
- Students can possibly complete and graduate high school with earning an Associates Degree at the same time!
- Students must get the high school principal or his/her designee's approval prior to course registration.
- Grades will be recorded on the student's high school transcript & will be included in GPA calculations. Any course under three credit hours will be recorded on the transcript; but not calculated in the GPA.
- The cost is \$47.25 (whether you take 1 or more classes) + books.
- Freshman MAY be eligible to take and earn college credits.
