- 4 Math- (Math I, II, III, and a 4<sup>th</sup> level math)
- 4 Social Studies- Civics & Econ, World History, AHI, AHII
  - APUSH counts as AHI and AHII credit. However, you still must take a 4<sup>th</sup> social studies.
- 3 Science- Earth & Environmental, Biology, A Physical Science (physical science, chemistry, physics)

\*You must have 27 credits to graduate

# CAREER AND COLLEGE PROMISE (CCP)

- CCP classes give students dual (high school and college) credit. Available as online or seated classes.
- Some CCP classes are equivalent to high school required courses. However, this is not true for all classes.
  - Example:
    - HIS131 satisfies our American History I credit
    - ENG111 does not satisfy our English III or IV credit
- You will choose <u>CCP Placeholder</u> if you are going to take a CCP class.
- Requirements:
  - Rising Junior or Senior
  - 2.8 Unweighted GPA- complete the application and student agreement form
