# New Graduation Requirements

Ohio law introduced new, permanent graduation requirements for students in the class of 2023 and beyond.



We know that there are many questions regarding these new requirements.

# New Graduation Requirements

The new legislation created 3 separate requirement areas:

*Students must meet the requirements for **each** of the 3 areas to earn a high school diploma.*

# CREDITS – *Unchanged*

## OVERALL CREDITS: 21 credits

- English (4 credits)
- Math (4 credits, including Algebra II)
- Science (3 credits)
- Social Studies (3 credits)
  - World History (.5 credits)
  - US History (1 credit)
  - Government (.5 credits)
  - 1 credit of additional coursework
- Fine Art (1 credit)
- Health (.5 credits)
- Physical Education (2 units)
  - 2 semesters of PE classes and/or Dance Fitness
  - 2 units of PE waiver for 2 qualifying extracurricular/co-curricular seasons
- Additional credits to reach 21 credits



# COMPETENCY

In addition to the required 21 credits, students must earn a “competency” score on 2 specific end-of-course exams which are also referred to as a Ohio State Tests or OSTs.



The score required for Algebra I and English II is a **684**.

- Tests are also scored 1-5, and a 684 falls in the high 2 range.

*Students will automatically be given these tests the spring of the year they are enrolled in each class.*

# COMPETENCY – *Alternatives*

In general, most CHS students will be able to reach the required scores on the Algebra I and English II at the completion of each course. However, Ohio law established three alternatives to demonstrating competency on state tests after students have re-tested in Algebra I and/or English II and still not met point requirements.

1. **College Credit Plus** – Earn college credit in a non-remedial math or English course (for the subject area not passed) to demonstrate competency.
2. **Career Experience and Technical Skill** – Complete two demonstrations to show competency, at least one of which must be a foundational option.
3. **Military Readiness** – Meeting the requirements to enlist in the military, demonstrated by a enlistment contract.

# READINESS

In addition to CREDIT and COMPETENCY requirements, students must also demonstrate READINESS by earning 2 of the 12 possible seals.



State law created 12 diploma seals for students to demonstrate academic, technical and professional readiness for careers, college, the military, or self-sustaining professions.

- *Seals earned will appear on both the student transcript and the diploma.*

# READINESS

Of the 12 seals, 9 are State-Defined Seals and 3 are Locally-Defined Seals.

## 9 State-Defined Seals\*

- Science
- Citizenship
- Biliteracy
- Honors Diploma
- Technology
- College-Ready
- OhioMeansJobs
- Industry-Recognized Credential
- Military Enlistment

## 3 Locally-Defined Seals

- Community Service
- School Engagement
- Fine and Performing Arts

\*At least one of the 2 required READINESS seals, must be a State-Defined Seal!



# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Science Seal

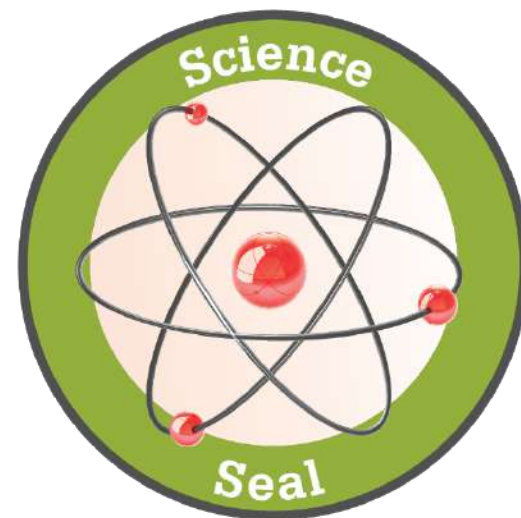
- Earn a score of proficient (3) or higher on the biology end-of-course exam (OST)

OR

- Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2) on appropriate Advanced Placement exam:
  - AP Biology
  - AP Chemistry
  - AP Physics 1: Algebra-Based
  - AP Physics 2: Algebra-Based
  - AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism
  - AP Physics C: Mechanics

OR

- Earn a letter grade of “B” or higher in any three-credit hour College Credit Plus science course.



# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Citizenship Seal

- Earn a score of proficient (3) or higher on BOTH the American History and the American Government end-of-course exams (OSTs)

OR

- Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2) on appropriate Advanced Placement exam:
  - AP US History
  - AP US Government and Politics

OR

- Earn a letter grade of “B” or higher in any three-credit hour College Credit Plus courses in BOTH American History and American Government course.



*Note: Students can use differing score sources for the two required areas of History and Government. (ex. a OST score and an AP score, a CCP grade and OST score, a CCP grade and an AP score)*

# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Biliteracy Seal

- Demonstrate proficiency requirements on assessments in a world language and English.

Students must meet requirement in both areas:

### ENGLISH

- A proficient score (3) on the ELA II OST

### WORLD LANGUAGE

- A score of 4 or higher on an AP foreign language examination

**OR**

- A proficient/qualifying score on the STAMP 4S test

# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Honors Diploma Seal

- Earn one of the available Honors Diplomas.
  - The ODE has more information on additional options [here](#).



| ACADEMIC HONORS DIPLOMA |   |
|-------------------------|---|
| Math                    | 4 units   |
| Science                 | 4 units, including 2 units of advanced science  |
| Social Studies          | 4 units   |
| World Languages         | 3 units of one world language, or no less than 2 units of each of two world languages studied |
| Fine Arts               | 1 unit  |
| GPA                     | 3.5 on a 4.0 scale  |
| ACT/SAT                 | ACT: 27 or higher/SAT: 1280 or higher   |

# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Technology Seal

- Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2) on an appropriate Advanced Placement exam
  - AP Computer Science A
  - AP Computer Science Principles

**OR**

- Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a “B” or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program

**OR**

- Earn credit in any combination of two of the semester courses, earn credit in one of the full year courses, or complete a block program. These options are listed on the next slide.



# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## College Ready Seal

- Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT, as outlined below:

|            |                                     |                  |
|------------|-------------------------------------|------------------|
| <b>ACT</b> | <b>English : 18<br/>Reading: 22</b> | <b>Math: 22</b>  |
| <b>SAT</b> | <b>EBRW: 480</b>                    | <b>Math: 530</b> |



# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## OhioMeansJobs Seal

- Demonstrate proficiency in each of 15 identified professional skills

**AND**

- Use the [OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal Form](#) to record demonstration of each professional skill

**AND**

- Work with a mentor to validate each skill across a minimum of two of the three environments (school, work, community)





# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Industry-Recognized Credential Seal

- Earn a 12-point approved industry-recognized credential

OR

- Earn a group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.

# READINESS – State-Defined Seals

## Military Enlistment Seal

- Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces.
- The information below includes links the specific enlistment requirements for each branch of the armed forces and relevant information for early enlistment for high school students.

# READINESS – Locally-Defined Seals

## Community Service Seal

- Complete one meaningful community service project pre-approved by CHS school administration

OR

- Complete a minimum of 60 hours of verified community service through a service organization or club



# READINESS – Locally-Defined Seals

## School Engagement Seal

- Meaningfully participate in 3 units of any combination of school-related activities approved by the high school administration
  - Examples: Athletics Teams and Clubs, CHS Clubs (Astronomy Club, Book Club, Chess Club, etc.), Academic Honors Societies, Student Government, etc.

*The 3 units cannot all come from the same school year.*

- Units are defined as a season, a production, a year of service in a role (like student government), or unit of time determined by the administration to be appropriate.
- Participation in these activities must be verified by the advisor of the activity or the administration.



# READINESS – Locally-Defined Seals

## Fine and Performing Arts Seal

- Earn one additional fine arts credit beyond the graduation requirement (2 credits total)

OR

- Participate in a minimum of 2 units of extra/co-curricular fine arts activities
  - Units are defined as a season, a production, a year of service in a role (like student government), or unit of time determined by the administration to be appropriate.
  - Participation in these activities must be verified by the advisor of the activity or the administration.
