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- I. In compliance with the *Parents' Right to Know* provision of the No Child Left Behind Act, Daleville City Schools will notify the parents of each student attending any school receiving funds under Title I, Part A, Section 1111(h)(6), Section 1112(g) and Title III, Section 3302, upon request, regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers. The information will include, at a minimum, the following:
 - A. Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction:
 - B. Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
 - C. The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher;
 - D. The field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
 - E. Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
- II. Daleville City Schools will provide additional information, as prescribed by the regulations, on teachers who do not meet the "highly qualified" provisions of the No Child Left Behind Act by the deadlines prescribed by the state.
- III. The System will provide information to the parents of each child on the child's level of performance on the state assessments.
- IV. This information will be provided in a timely manner, in an understandable and uniform format, and to the extent practicable, in a language that the parents can understand.
