

Dear Parents/Guardians: Re: Medication Paperwork for the 2019-20 School Year

Our records show that your child had prescription medication at school this year. <u>There is a new version of the</u> <u>School Medication Prescriber/Parent Authorization (PPA) that is to be used for prescription medication for the</u> <u>2019-20 school year</u>. This new version is attached for you to take to your child's physician for completion.

Instructions for Completing SCHOOL MEDICATION PRESCRIBER/PARENT AUTHORIZATION (PPA)

- Student Information Section: Parent/Guardian must complete
- **Prescriber Authorization Section**: Physician, Physician's Assistant or Nurse Practitioner must complete
- Parent Authorization Section: School Nurse and Parent/Guardian must complete
- **Self-Administration Authorization Section:** To be completed ONLY if student is authorized to complete self-care by licensed healthcare provider.

SCHOOL MEDICATION PRESCRIBER/PARENT AUTHORIZATION (PPA) IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 1. Prescription label must match (PPA)
- 2. A separate PPA is required for <u>each</u> medication
- 3. <u>PARENT/GUARDIAN</u> must bring in PPA(s) and medication(s) directly to the school nurse. Students, unless prescribed to 'Self-Administer/Self-Carry', may not bring in their own medication(s). <u>ALL</u> medications (prescription and over-the counter medication) must be counted & logged-in with the school nurse.
- 4. <u>EXPIRED MEDICATION</u>: Parent/Guardian, be aware of medication expiration dates before you deliver them to school. The nurse will notify you when your child's medication expires.
- 5. <u>AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS</u>: Parent/Guardian must bring a separate container of medication. Extended Day programs do not have access to the clinic supply of medication for your child.
- 6. <u>END OF SCHOOL YEAR</u>: All medication(s) must be signed out at the end of the school year. Medication(s) left in the clinic after that time will be discarded according to federal & state guidelines
- **7.** <u>SUMMER PROGRAMS</u>: Parent/Guardian is responsible to provide medication(s) a copy of PPA(s) to each summer program

Please Note: <u>Management Plans will no longer be sent home for the physician to complete.</u> <u>Your school nurse will be in contact with you at the beginning of the 2019-20 School Year for</u> <u>discussion of your child's Individualized Health Care Plan.</u>
