## **Montgomery Public Schools' First Class Pre-K Alabama's Voluntary Pre-K Program PRE-REGISTRATION**

- MPS' First Class Pre-K program is accepting online pre-registration applications for the 2022-2023 school year beginning January 17<sup>th</sup>. (If you need assistance accessing the online application, contact an MPS First Class Pre-K school/program.)
- Pre-registration is open to all children four years of age by 9/1/22\* who are residents of Alabama. (Children eligible to attend kindergarten do not qualify for pre-k.)
- Registrants must provide two proofs of residence – either a current utility bill or a copy of a lease or mortgage – and a copy of the child's birth certificate. **However, upon being selected into the program, parents must provide all of the following to complete enrollment:** child's birth certificate, immunization record, two proofs of residence, and a copy of the parents' state-issued IDs. (Upload documents into the online pre-registration site.)
- Montgomery Public Schools has zoning requirements that determine eligibility for attending a program at particular schools. (Contact the school for attendance zone information.)
- There is no registration fee for the MPS' First Class Pre-K program.
- No child will be denied participation based on income, sex, race, color, national origin, or disability.
- Program hours are 7:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. ALL students must be picked up by 2:45 p.m.
- **TRANSPORTATION FOR PRE-K IS NOT PROVIDED BY THE MPS SCHOOL SYSTEM.**

**Acceptance into Montgomery Public Schools' First Class Pre-K program is strictly through a random selection drawing. Email notices of acceptance status will be sent.**
