## **Pre-K Enrollment across the United States**

The National Institute for Early Education Research (NIEER), a unit of Rutgers University, has published annual state pre-K reports for the last decade. *The State of Preschool 2011*, for the 2010-2011 school year, includes detailed profiles for each state's pre-kindergarten programs and tracks funding, access, and policies.

The nine states in this table have the highest percent of children enrolled in state pre-K. Unlike most states, they offer Universal pre-K and eligibility is based solely on age.

The percentage of 4-year-olds served by pre-K varies significantly by state. State pre-K enrollment at age 4 varied from 0 to 76% in the 2010-2011 school year. Florida had the highest percentage of 4-year-olds enrolled in state pre-K.

In the last few years, the states with the largest percentage change in preschool enrollment have been Vermont, Iowa and Florida. In 2010, Vermont eliminated the cap on enrollment; Iowa's program, which started in 2007-2008, expanded access to all 4-year-olds and has grown considerably.

Participation rates are calculated from 4-year-olds enrollment numbers published by each state and population of 4-year-olds from the Census Bureau's datasets. NIEER used the 2010 Census data for the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years. In previous years, estimates for the month of July were used to calculate participation rates. Enrollment numbers and participation rates for the 2011-2012 school year were gathered from each state. Participation rates are estimated using the state's population estimate or Census estimates. *The State of Preschool 2012* will be published in April 2013.
