Understanding Title I Programs:

An Overview for Parents



- Federal Program which provides extra funding to schools with high percentages of students living in low income situations.
- Oakwood is a school-wide Title I school which means we can use the funding to offer flexible services based on our School Improvement Plan.
- This funding is used to ensure that everyone has a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education.

What is Title 1?

- Stoney Creek has a School Improvement Plan and a Title I Plan
- Stoney Creek uses Title I Supplemental funding to provide:
 - Professional Development for Staff
 - Salaries for select teachers and teacher assistants
 - Instructional programs and research based interventions for students not meeting proficiency
 - Parental Involvement activities (Family Night Events)
 - Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K) services
