Earle Elementary School currently serves **318** students, preschool/prekindergarten through sixth. We have 38 students in preschool/prekindergarten, 38 students in kindergarten, 41 students in first grade, 52 students in second grade, 37 students in third grade, 37 students in fourth grade, 38 students in the fifth grade, and 37 students in the sixth grade. We have **18** certified teachers, **5** teachers working under additional licensure programs, and **13** classified staff.

Based on the 2015 School Report Card, Earle High School was assigned a grade of D. The school is classified as a *Needs Improvement* school in regards to academic performance under the ESEA Flexibility Renewal Waiver.

As of the 2015 school year, the third through sixth grade students are assessed using the ACT Aspire Assessment.



EARLE HIGH SCHOOL

Earle High School currently serves **292** students, grades seven through twelve. We have 44 students in seventh grade, 42 students in eighth grade, 54 students in ninth grade, 69 students in tenth grade, 37 students in the eleventh grade, and 46 students in the twelfth grade. We have **21** certified teachers, **7** teachers working under additional licensure programs or waivers, and **9** classified staff.

Based on the 2015 School Report Card, Earle High School was assigned a grade of C. The school remains classified as a Priority school in need of improvement under the ESEA Flexibility Renewal Waiver. Priority schools status means that the school is within 5% of schools with the lowest performance over a three year period.

As of the 2015 school year, the seventh through tenth grade students are assessed using the ACT Aspire Assessment.
